Change Parking Side For Wesleyan Cars

From now on cars will park on the south side of Wesleyan Street, not the north side as has been the custom in the past. At present the parking meters are on the north side. The motion was passed at Council last Monday night at Cr. E. Hyde's suggestion. "The trucks unloading on one side of Wesleyan St. and the cars parked on the other side, frequently block the street," said Cr. Hyde. His idea is simply to have the cars park on the same side as the trucks, so that one area is left as a clear thoroughway. Cr. Ballentine wondered about the legality of cars parked facing the other way. "The cars will be on the south side with their left wheels to the curb," replied Cr. Hyde. Only Cr. Emmerson opposed, saying he would like to have a good look at it before voting.
