Driver Sentenced for Criminal Negligence

A 23 year old Georgetown bricklayer was convicted of criminal negligence causing the death of Peter Armstrong, 16, in county court Wednesday Sept. 14.

The accused broke down and sobbed and his wife was led crying from the courthouse as Mr. Justice Donnelly sentenced him to 18 months definite and 18 months indefinite imprisonment.

The charge arose from a fatal accident at the intersections of Guelph St. and Sinclair Ave. July 12.

Peter Armstrong, 16, was crushed to death under a car when the accused's car smashed into the youth's motorcycle from behind.

The verdict was delivered by John C. Hall, foreman of the all-male jury after deliberation for almost four hours.

Crown Attorney Peter K. McWilliams said there had been seven prosecutions of criminal negligence causing death in Halton County in the past eight years.

"In every one of them alcohol has been one of the major factors," he added.

An analyst estimated the accused had consumed 8 or 9 pints of beer before driving.

96 Purebred Herds in Record of Performance

The results of the Record of Performance for dairy cattle for the year ending February 28th, 1966, have been received. A total of 96 purebred herds in Halton were tested under ROP. This was an increase of 8 herds from the previous year.

Of the seventy-one Holstein herds tested, Jos. Schertzl, Norval, R R 1, had the highest combined breed Class Average for milk and Butterfat, with a BOA of 146 and 149 respectively. Runners-up were: Fred Nurse, Georgetown, 150-139; Howson Ruddell, Georgetown, 139-148; A. G. Hunter, Burlington, 141-143; J. C. Reid, Georgetown, 146-142; A. M. Sherwood, Burlington 144-137; and W. J. Mahon, Campbellville, 132-148.

For the Jersey breed, with 12 herds on test: Ken Ellis and Son, Hornby, were high with a BOA of 146-140; and next were B. H. Bull, Norval, 158 - 140; Maurice C. Beatty, Milton, 139-137; and Mac Alexander, Norval, 137-137.

For Guerneys, with 7 herds, three breeders were tied for top position, John Y. McNabb, Georgetown, 128-130; Estate of H. D. McPherson, Georgetown 132-128; and Kingsholm Farm, Oakville 132-126.

Of the three Dual Purpose Shortborn herds, A. H. McGibbon, Milton, had a BOA of 131 for milk and 128 for butterfat.

Although there are only three Ayrshire herds in the county on test, the top BOA came from this breed. A. H. Clark, Georgetown, averaged 169 for milk and 155 for butterfat, on 28 head of Ayrshire.

By combining these herds on R.O.P. with the 63 herds in our Dairy Herd Improvement Associations, it is noted that over fifty percent of our dairy herds in Halton are on official test.

Each year, production records are of greater importance in determining the price paid for a dairy cow or heifer. With the excellent export demand for our dairy cattle, every Halton County farmer should be testing his cows if he is to obtain maximum profits for his management.
