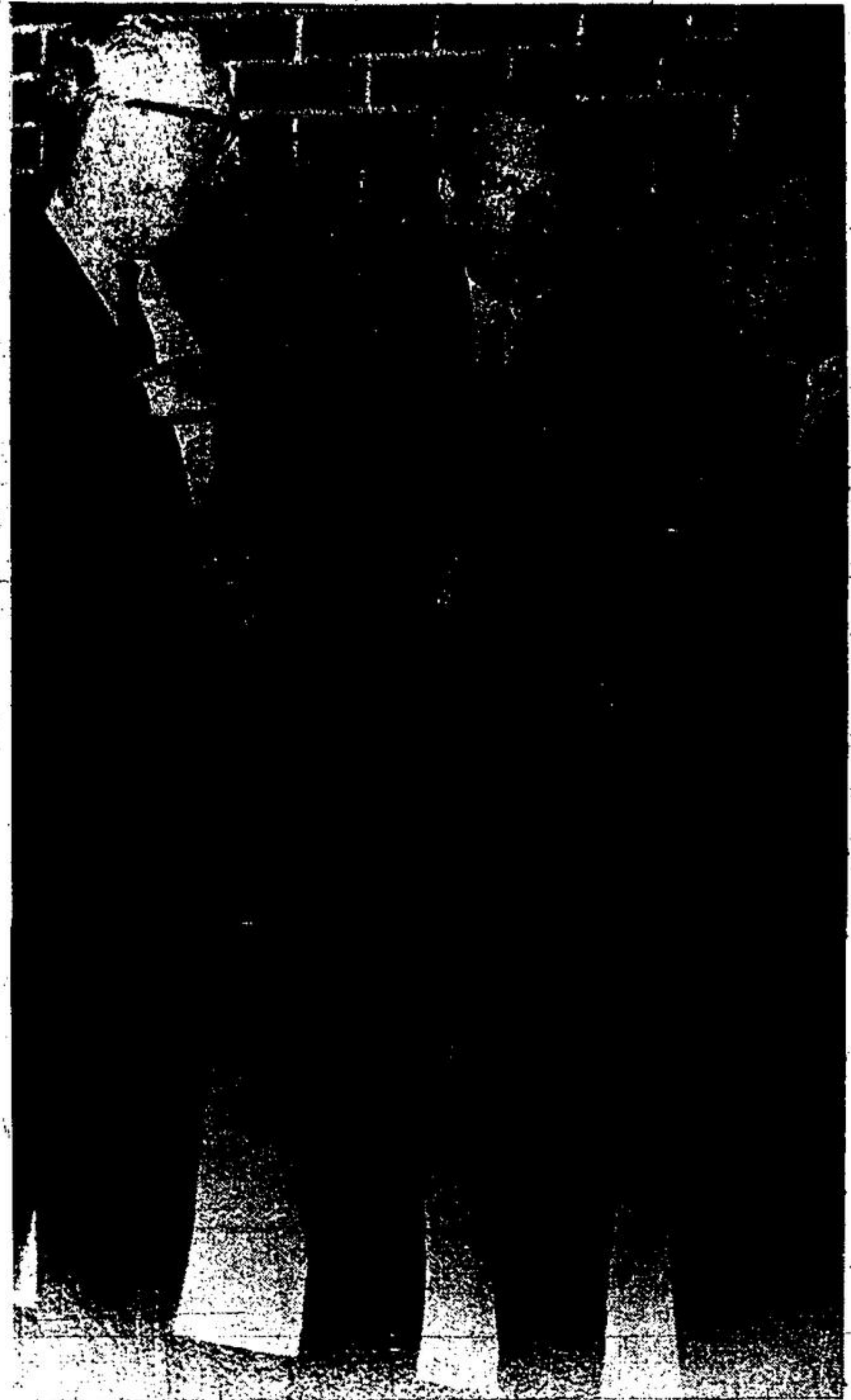


PEEL-HALTON REPORT RELEASED

It was Plunkett Report Night and much speculation took place before the actual unveiling of the Halton-Peel study. Going clockwise, picture on the top right shows Municipal Affairs Minister Wilfred J. Spooner, George Kerr, MPP for Halton County and Dr. Lorne Cumming, former deputy minister of municipal affairs and now special adviser to Minister Spooner.
