DON'T BE ASHAMED

Shame (over an untidy house), fear (of consequences), ignorance (of what its' all about) forget these things if you have an ounce of common sense. Welcome the fire fighter if he knocks at your door, suggesting a looksee for fire hazards.

Close your door to fire, keep it open for fire prevention. This neatly describes the philosophy of Canada's campaign for greater fire salety in the home, on the job, and everywhere. In plants, office buildings, stairwells, fire doors must be kept closed. Why? To shut off live air (oxygen) from fueling a fire. In the home, too, a closed door will slow down the spread of fire.

Long Way

But because three-quarters of all fires happen in the home, and because the basic hazards are quite-simple (over-fusing, frayed wiring, faulty heaters, rubbish and the like) their elimination will go a long way in prevention. Hence the purpose of the fire fighter's call. But why wait for the fire fighter? Check these hazards yourself. Or call the fire chief and make
