Ever wonder what happened to Elmer Lee, who for two seasons served as fiery coach of the Georgetown Intermediate A Raiders? Well he's back in the game — this time with Raider's one-time rivals the Oakville Oaks.

Oaks announced last week the hiring of former Georgetown boss Elmer Lee as boss for the coming season. Lee is the third coach to handle the Oaks in the senior circuit.

Lee, an Islington native, coached Georgetown Raiders in both the 1960-61 and 1961-62 seasons and guided them to the league finals in his first year.

Before that he coached in the Metro Junior B circuit and played and coached in the old Mercantile Hockey League.

Most of his Mercantile coaching was done with the Stockyards team in an era when the circuit was close to senior caliber.
