**Birth Control Report Ready Soon: Harley**

Ottawa (Special to the Herald) A significant report on birth control legislation in Canada is expected to reach to government some time before the end of October.

Dr. Harry Harley, MP for Halton and chairman of the common standing committee on health and welfare said this week that his committee's report on the controversial subject should be ready for tabling in the house soon.

The committee has been waiting for presentation of a brief from the Canadian Catholic Conference and this brief is expected to be made public at the committee's meeting. "This is the final presentation the committee has been waiting for and once it is received we will be able to meet privately to prepare the committee's report," Dr. Harley said.

The committee is then expected to turn to consideration of a private member's resolution on legalized abortion, submitted by Toronto MP Ian Whan. This resolution was one of those included in the committee's original terms of reference but was not considered until the birth control resolutions had been dealt with.

In the meantime, Dr. Harley is preparing for a lengthy series of fall meetings by the special food and drug committee which is looming into the cost of drugs into Canada.

The committee resumes its hearings next Tuesday with a presentation by the Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons of Quebec. Next Thursday the committee will hear from Lawrence Wilson of Montreal on methods of advertising drugs.

Each Tuesday and Thursday during the remainder of the fall the committee will hear other briefs from the six major drug companies in Canada, from the Cystic Fibrosis Society, the Canadian Association of Consumers and other groups and individuals.

"We have enough witnesses to keep us busy until early December and we hope to have our first report ready for parliament by the Christmas recess," Dr. Harley said.
