

# High School Student with Summer 'Bluenose' Crew

A dream by many a young man was fulfilled by Bob Quigley, Grade 13 student at Georgetown High School, this summer, when he served as a deckhand aboard a sailing schooner — the famous Bluenose.

This is the reconstructed Bluenose, made of the same wood and to the same dimensions as the original.

After reading an article about the reconstructed Bluenose, Bob wrote the owners Oland Breweries, who put him in touch with the captain, and he was hired for the summer.

From June 20th till the end of August, the schooner plied its way up and down the Nova Scotia coast, to Prince Edward Island, St. John, New Brunswick and to Newfoundland.

The schooner is now used for conventions and good-will tours, while in winter it is chartered in the West Indies.

Next year many visitors will see it anchored at Expo '67, where it will be Quebec Premier D. Johnson's flagship.

The Bluenose was built at Lunenburg, Nova Scotia, where the "Bounty" for the movie "Mutiny on the Bounty" was also built. The "Bounty" was sailed to Tahiti by the same captain and bosun who now sail it off Florida. The crews of the Bluenose and the Bounty frequently are interchanged.

For the real sailing buffs, the Bluenose is 143 feet long, not including the bowsprit. Her main mast stands 127 feet high and her foremast 118 ft. high.

She carries 10,000 square ft. of sail, and has the largest working sail in the world. There is a crew of fourteen, eight of which including Bob are deckhands.

The original Bluenose was launched in March 1921, won the sailing championship of the North Atlantic that year and was never defeated, reigning as Queen of the North Atlantic fishing fleets until she was wrecked off Haiti in January of 1946. The Canadian dime bears her picture.

Bob doesn't want to be a sailor, but plans to study marine biology at the University of Guelph.
