Alert Airforceman Spots Defect — Is Commended

RCAF Corporal H.R. Stoddart, stationed at Trenton, has been recognized for discovering a controls defect while making a functional check on an airplane, and preventing a major accident. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J.C. Stoddart, 17 Arletta St. Georgetown,

While carrying out the routine check on a Dakota aircraft Corporal Stoddart, detected a slight binding of the elevator controls. He was sufficiently concerned over the condition to investigate it further. As. result it was determined that the elevator cable assembly was fouling the pitot lines and had in fact almost worn the tines completely through.

If this had happened during flight, the resulting loss pressure to the aircraft's flight instruments would have severe ly jeopardized the safety the plane and possibly resulted in a major accident.




