Consultants to Evaluate Services of Health Unit

The Warnock-Hersey Company Ltd., management consultants, has been authorized to conduct an investigation into the affairs of Halton County Health Unit.

The firm will "review and evaluate the services being provided" by the staff at the Unit.

The study is expected to cost around \$2,400.

The decision to make the investigation was made last month during the climax of the public health nurses' dispute with County Council and Board of Health.

County Warden Herbert H. Hinton said at the time: "the Board of Health and County Council has been accused of lack of operating correctly. The study is to establish where the weakness lies and just what conditions are."

The move came following the mass walk-out of Halton's 22 public health nurses at the Unit.

They resigned en-bloc after fruitless requests for recognition as a collective bargaining unit.

They returned to work last week and discussions are continuing with County Council's Special Committee, headed by Warden Hinton.
