Raiders Tank Tigers 10 - 5 Hartley Joins Defence Corps

Raiders pulled the Tigers' tail and got away with it Sunday afternoon.

Eight hundred and fifty hockey addicts watched as Georgetown overpowered the Suburban Junior C League's current flagbearers 10-5 and shored up their chances for a centennial year title in the battle of the unbeaten in the Georgetown Memorial Arena.

Going into this one Aurora Tigers had clawed all opposition for an 8 and 0 record. Raiders' unblemish history consisted of 5 triumphs and 3 deadlocks.

The major win tightened Georgetown's grip on second place and left them just one point off the Tigers' heels.

To take over the helm Raiders will have to wade through the toughest weekend schedule of the season without getting ailed. They tangle with Aurora tonight (Thursday) and the fast rising Milton Merchants tomorrow, in back to back away games, and then host their Milton rivals Sunday afternoon.

Georgetown coach Gerry Ingle played chess with his assignments to fill holes left by Ron Lane's departure and Jim Blair's forced absence, and hit on some potent combinations.

A new unit of Don Norton, Terry Lane and Brad Johnston accounted for half of the Raider output, and a package of Rick Maloney, Ron Stewart and Terry Hay scored four. The Paul Robinson, Bill Dwyer, Mike Cummins trio didn't get on the sheet.

Ron Stewart led the snipers with three goals, Brad Johnston and Terry Lane scored two apiece, and Don Norton, Terry Hay and Rod Presswood struck for the balance.

Georgetown led their strongest defense corps of the campaign made possible by the return of 1965-66 standout Russ Hartley. The spectacled rear-guard teamed with Rod Presswood, Dave McMenemy, Phil Lavell and Doug Malcolm for the Tiger hunt.

Georgetown ran up a 3-1 advantage in the first period, owned a 5-3 edge after two and outscored Tigers 5-2 in the last twenty minutes.

Here's how the scoring went: First period: Stewart from Maloney at 5:56; Presswood from Robinson and Dwyer at 7:25; and Norton from Maloney and Presswood at 17:27 as Raiders took a 3-0 lead. Carleton from Gould counted for Tigers at 19:45.

Second period: Weir for Tigers from Gould and Carleton at 4:25; Hay for Raiders from Maloney at 4:45; Weir again assisted at 16:40; and Stewart from Presswood for Raiders at 17:43.

Third Period: Terry Lane put Georgetown ahead 6-2 unassisted at 2:29; Brad Johnston added the 7th from Hay at 5:03; Aurora's Whitfield scored from Alcorn at 5:13; Terry Lane from Terry Hay made it 8-4. Johnston at 6:10; Gould completed the Tigers scoring from Johnston at 6:25; and then Raiders' Hay into double figures from Presswood and Johnston from 17:58.

Blair's Fractured Arm Hampers Raider Line-up

Georgetown's red hot Junior C Raiders, won and lost in Orangeville Thursday night. They won the Suburban Junior C League Hockey game 7-3, but lost, for a few games at least, the services of one of their new solid performers in Jim Blair.

The former Boston Bruin draftee suffered an arm fracture early in what was shaping up as his best game of the season. He scored two first period goals to lead the Raiders to the victory.

Line mate Terry Lane, and Rick Maloney, Ron Stewart, Bill Dwyer and Paul Robinson notched the other Georgetown goals.

Crawley hit twice and McCulloch once for the loop tail-enders.

The win was Raiders 5th. They also have 3 ties and are still unbeaten after 8 starts.

Blair was taken to Dufferin County hospital for X-rays and then transferred to Georgetown District Memorial Hospital where his arm was operated on Friday morning. At writing time there is no word as to the anticipated length of his absence.

His departure, though temporary, left Raiders without two key men. Consistent high points scorer Ron Lane left the ranks to play exclusively for his university team.

Terry Lane fed Blair on the first scoring play of the game at 6:20. Rick Maloney kept up his production, pace with a goal a minute later from the league's top points collector Rod Presswood and Don Norton. Blair punched in Georgetown's third counter from rear-guard Allan Arnold and Terry Lane at 9:45 and it stood at 3-0 at the end of the period.

Lane whipped Arnold's pass into the Orangeville hut to put Raiders into a commanding 4-0 position with a little over 6 minutes of the second period elapsed.

Before the frame was exhausted the host club struck for a pair, Crawley from Mc-
