Warden Denies Budget Overspent for Trips

E.H. Hinton, warden of Halton County, Tuesday challenged a report that 1966 county councillors overspent \$10,248 on trips and treats.

An auditor's report made public Monday showed the county councillors spent \$12,548 for liquor, food and conventions.

The Ontario Municipal Act limits such expenditure to \$2,500 a year.

Mr. Hinton said the over-spending charge is the result of conflicting bookkeeping practice. "Our staff placed certain expenses under one heading but the auditors say they should have been placed under another."

The warden said the report has been on file with Ontario's municipal affairs department since March and it has not been questioned or challenged there.
