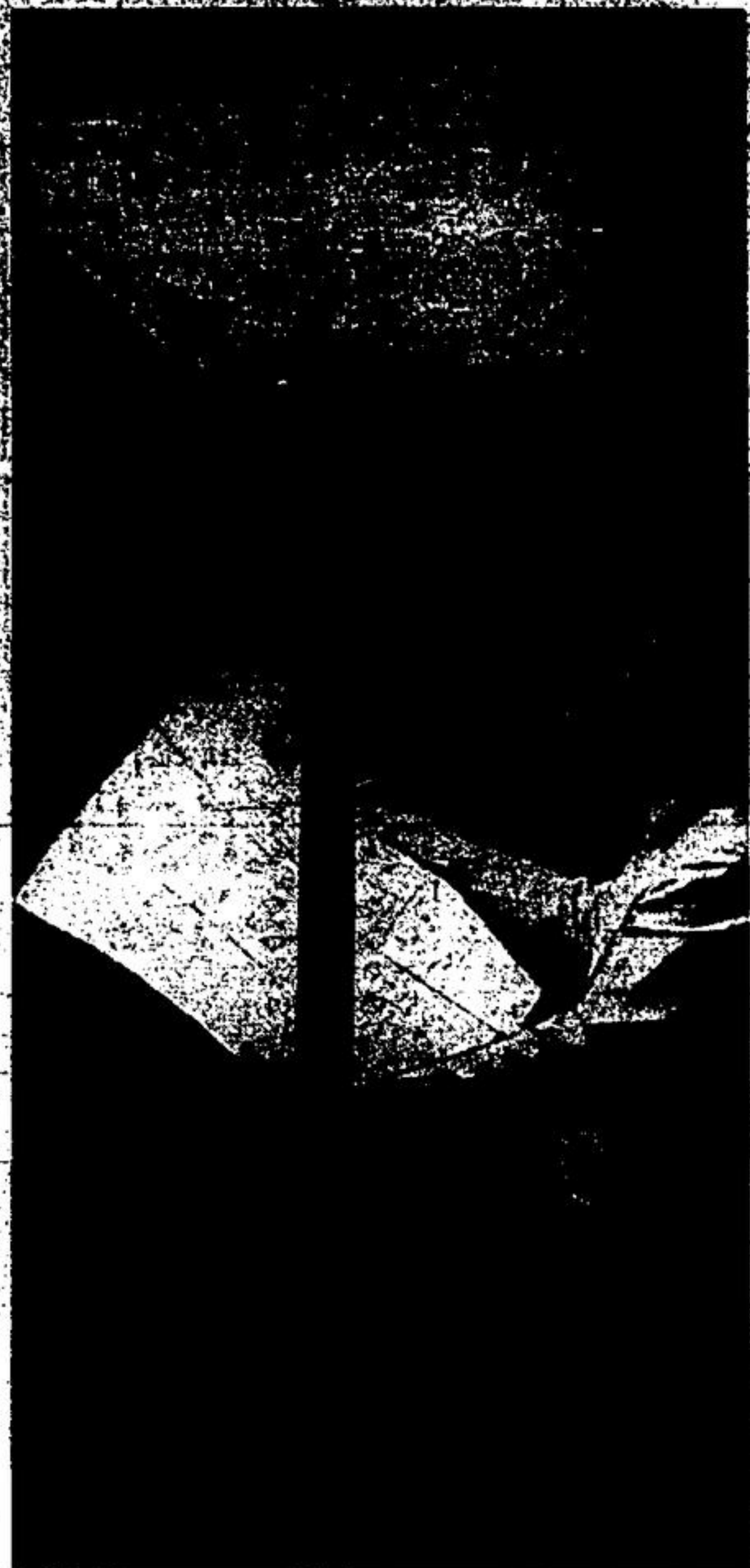


**Illuminated Signs Installed at Corners**
