

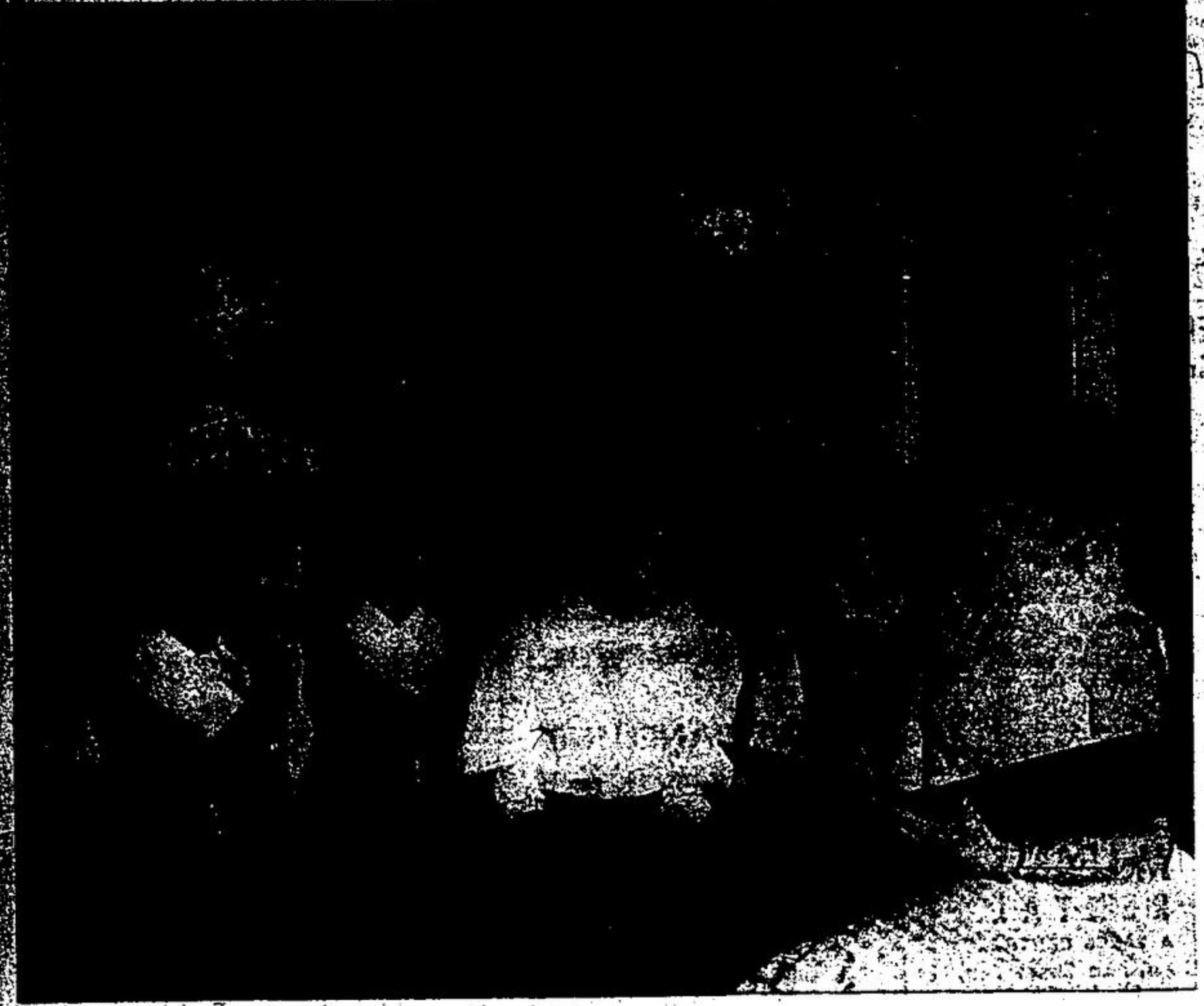
Doris Barrager's Rink Wins Mackenzie Trophy Tigers Nip Raiders 6-4

Apply Whitewash to Merchants In Penalty - Poked Junior Tilt

Every time Milton's Merchants reach up for a high rung on the OHA Suburban Junior C League ladder they get their fingers stepped on.

The Merchants tried it this weekend against their red-shirted rivals from Georgetown and Monday morning they were still winning. Raiders mauled Murray Grenke's outfit 7-0 in Georgetown Sunday afternoon kicking them in the county seat 5-3.

In four showdowns to date Raiders have beaten their Uncle Millies 3 times and played one tie while outscoring them 25 to 12.

Another good crowd of over 700 ringed the Georgetown Memorial ice Sunday afternoon to watch Raiders completely dominate Merchants in every period. Georgetown's marksmanship improved as the game progressed. Snipers found the range once in the first period, twice in the second and four times in the third.

The Sunday tilt also introduced a new twine minder in Len Reid to the Georgetown crowd and the impression strengthened by the shutout was obviously favourable. Merchants were at Reid's unveiling in Milton Friday night and his stinginess shaded the relationship.

Paul Robinson paced Georgetown scorers with a pair of goals. Don Norton, Rod Presswood, Rick Maloney, Brad Johnson, and Ron Stewart put the other pucks past Merchant

Twenty-seven penalties interrupted the struggle — 13 to Raiders. Merchant sentences included a misconduct and a match penalty to Joe Hore who protested a team mate's minor too strenuously and then attempted to trip referee W. Sikorsky on his way to the box.
