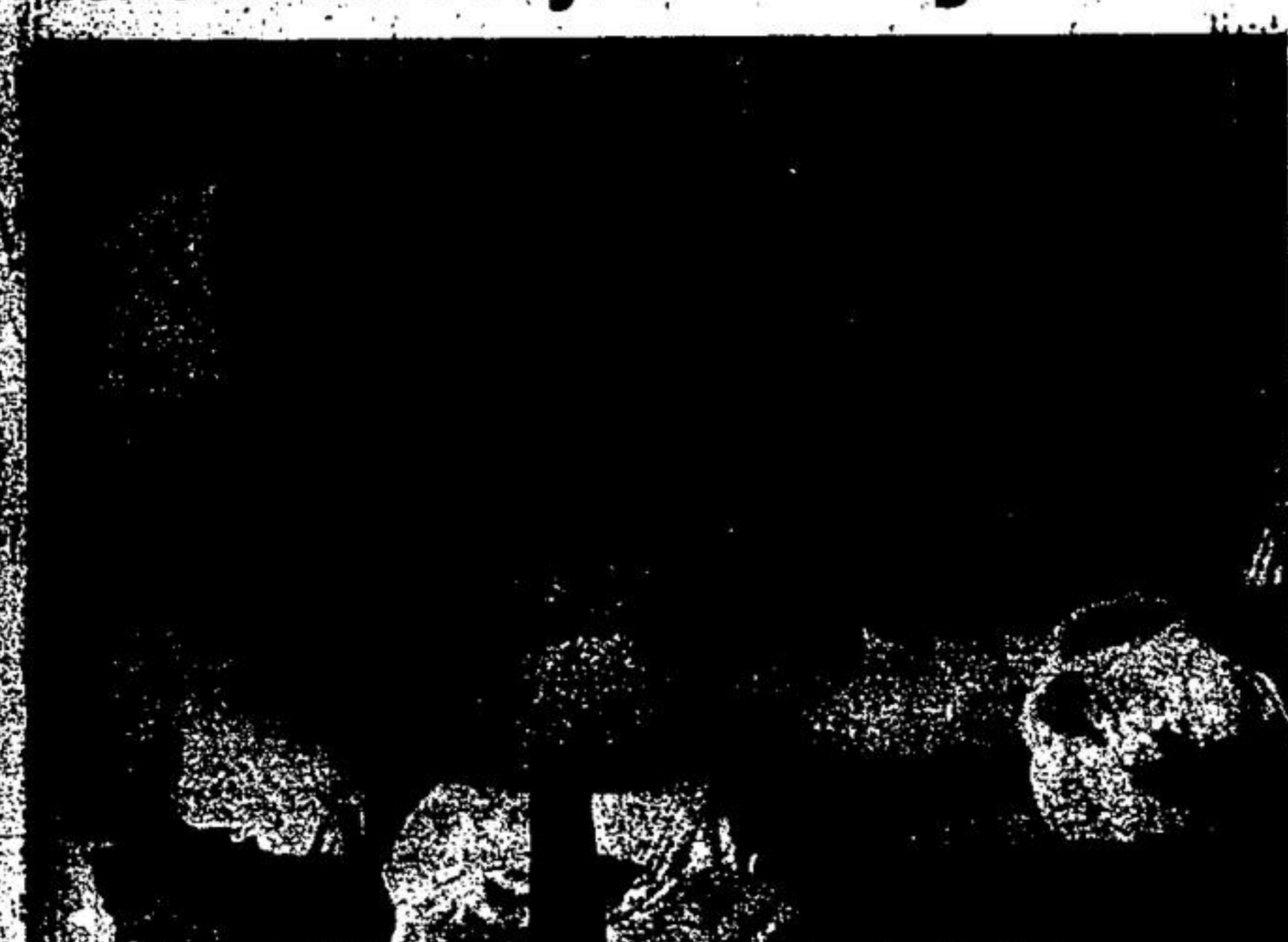

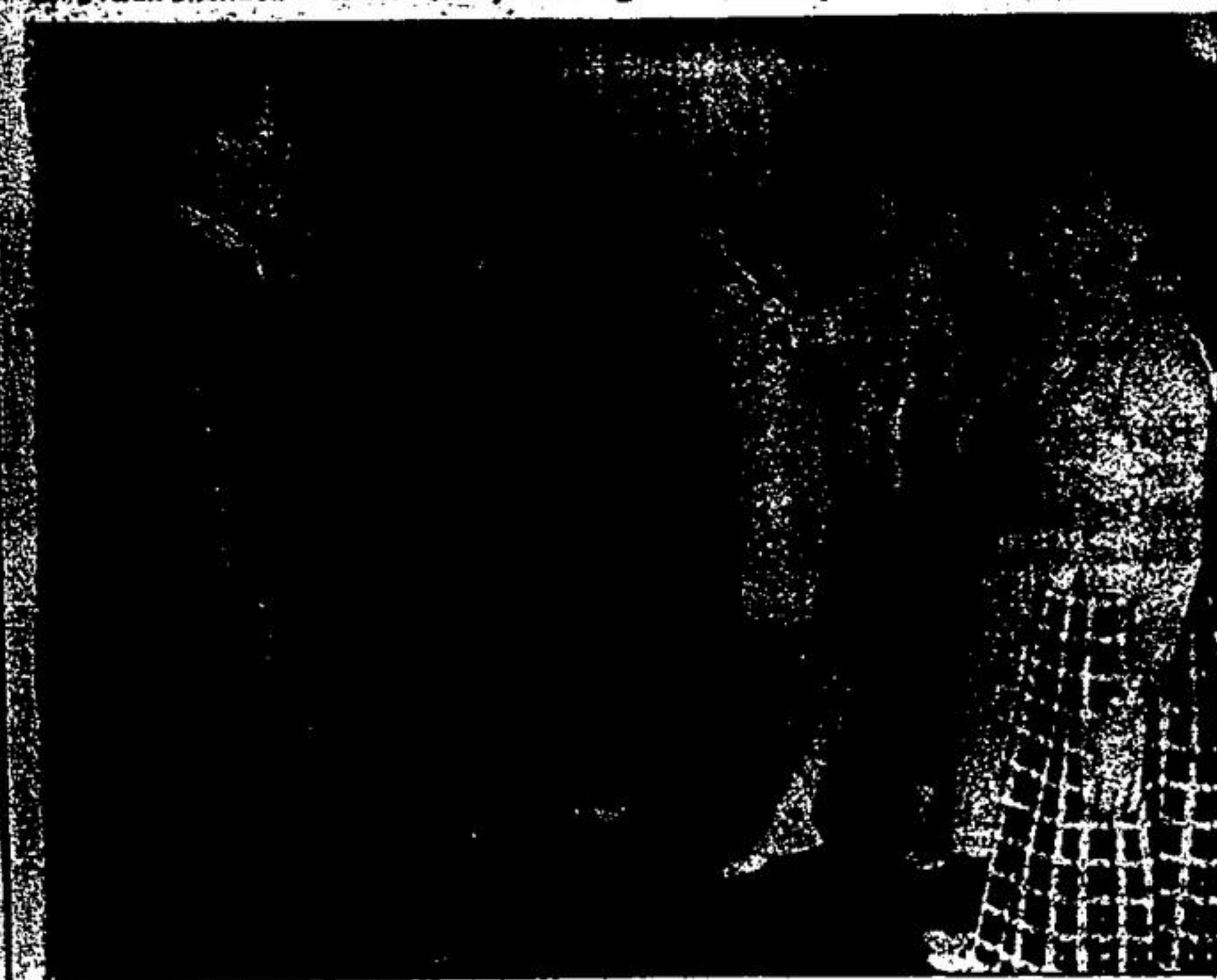

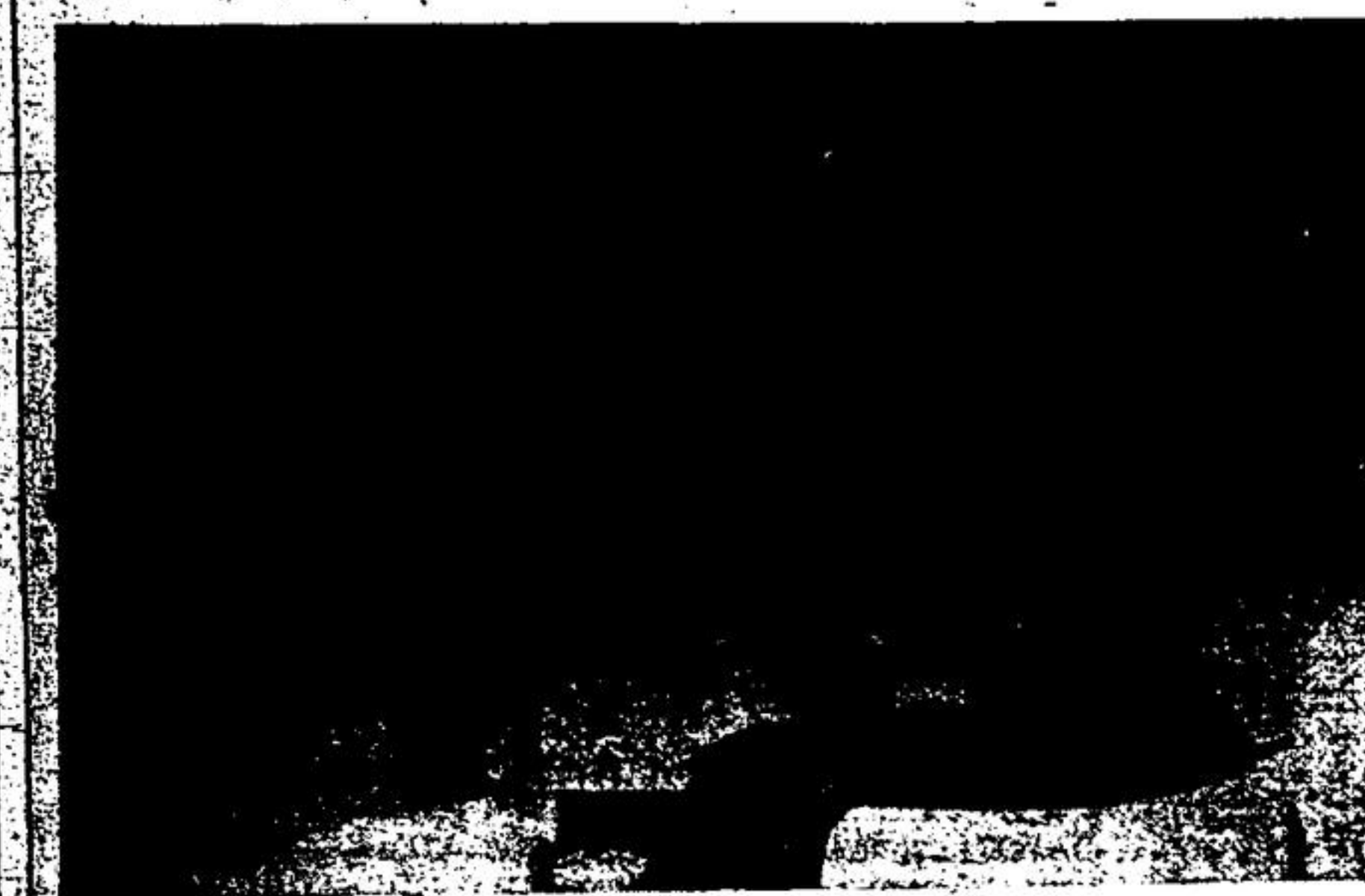
## Centennial Project Proving Its Worth
