The District 12 group, founded about 1937, held its final meeting recently and decided to turn its entire financial assets over to the North Halton Association for the Mentally Retarded which operates a school for 34 retarded at Hoply.

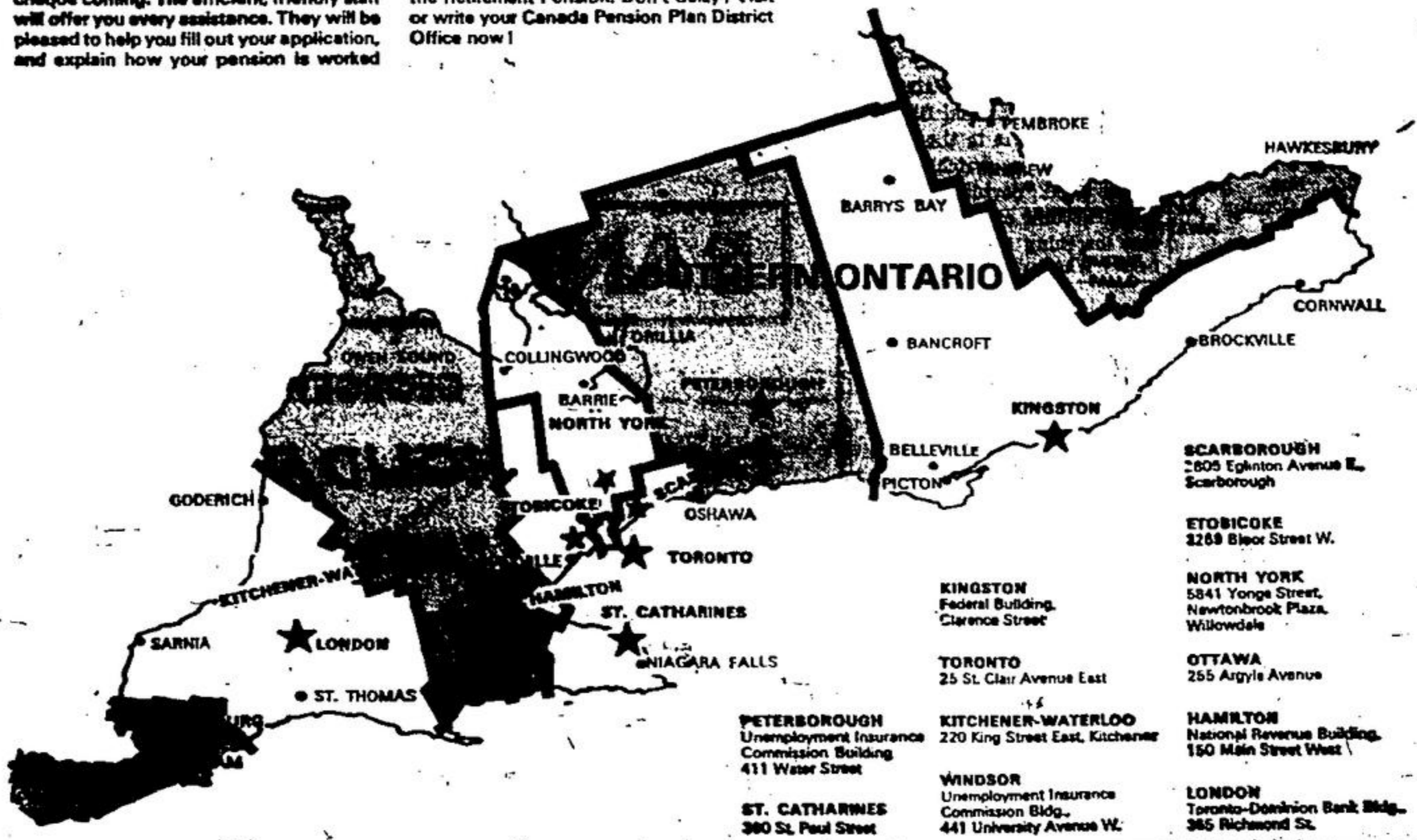
Are you eligible?
