First Place Raiders Riddle Redmen 10-1

The Robinson brothers, Kent and Paul, accounted for half the winners' goals as 1st place Georgetown Raiders riddled 5th place Newmarket Redmen 10-1 in an OHA Suburban Junior C contest in Georgetown Memorial Arena, Sunday.

Kent Robinson fired both his volleys in the first period and was later ejected after a continuing feud with Newmarket's Morton. The burley Raider laid off when Morton threw punches in their first clash, but everybody's eyebrows and Robinson's temper went up he was tagged a fighting major anyway. When he decided to get his five minutes worth out of Morton's maligned nose, both combatants were shown the way to the dressing rooms.

Paul Robinson started cashing in the last minutes of the second period. He counted the first of his three with a little over five minutes left in that stanza, and triggered Georgetown's only two third period goals.

Raiders constructed a 6-0 lead in the first period, inflated it with 2 more in the second frame and ran it into double figures in the third. Newmarket's only goal was chalked up half way through the final session.

Ron Stewart also had a two-goal afternoon while Bill Dwyer, Mike Cummins and Rick Maloney constructed the other goals.
