It took the Georgetown Raiders just one minute to demolish the Oakville Blades Friday night. The Raiders busted a tight, close-checking game wide open when they rammed home three goals in the space of a minute midway through the third period to earn a 6-1 victory over the Blades. Raiders had held on tenaciously to a 2-1 lead and the Blades were pressing for the tying goal in the third period when lightning struck. It was the first decisive game between the two arch-rivals this season — the first two clashes had ended in ties. Don Norton triggered two goals for the Raiders while Phil Lavell, Terry Hay, Paul Robinson and Rick Maloney bagged one each. Doug Thomson got the lone Oakville goal in the first period while the Raiders had two men in the penalty box. Both teams ignored the puck in the first period and went at each other with everything but the kitchen sink. Both clubs passed up good scoring chances in order to take a good run at an opposing player. The first period ended in a 1-1 tie with penalties playing a part in both goals. Thomson fired a wicked slapshot past Raider goalie Len Reid on a powerplay but minutes later with the Blades shorthanded, Norton finished off a play with Bill Dwyer to tie the count. The clubs continued to hammer each other in the second by a fight between Bill Perras of the Blades and Georgetown's Brad Johnson. Both players rolled on the ice swinging but neither could land a solid blow. Johnson drew a minor for high sticking to go along with his major sentence.
