The casting of various calibers of bullets came first, the lead is melted in an electric furnace then poured into the various moulds. The next steps are (1) full length resizing of the brass cartridge, (2) removal of the fired primer, (3) expanding the neck of the primer, (4) inserting new primer, (5) loading desired amount of powder, (6) seating new lead bullet.

The result is a perfect round of ammunition produced at a fraction of the cost of factory ammunition.

The second event of the month was a shooting match between the Maple Leaf Revolver Club of Toronto and the Georgetown Revolver Club. The Maple Leaf team consisted of Keith Hart, Norm Cupp, Ralph Broomhead, and WIM Olson. The Georgetown team was Ron Challenger, Ron Warnock, Norm Maher, and Norm Wodhams.
