Thirteen Injuries in Week's Accidents in North Halton

During the period December 11th to December 17th, 1966, inclusive, personnel of the North Halton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police worked a total of 914 1/2 hours and patrolled a total of 8,664 miles on area highways. As a result of patrol, 58 traffic charges were preferred, 73 traffic violation warnings were issued, and 52 convictions registered.

During the past week 6 property damage accidents, and 7 personal injury accidents were investigated resulting in 13 persons being injured and approximately \$9,680 in property damage. Contributing factors in accidents were: icy road conditions, illegal parking, inattentive driving, loss of control, defective equipment, careless driving, improper passing, right-of-way, excessive speed, mechanical defect and inexperience. 1 Hit and Run accident was investigated.

There were 22 general occurrences reported, including, Break and Enter at the Blue Springs Scout Reserve and at the Fishburn property at Norval — no property was stolen in either entry. Two assaults were investigated with action taken: one motorcycle was stolen, and one fraud investigated involving the passing of counterfeit money at the Mohawk Raceway. There was one liquor seizure made resulting in 2 charges under the Liquor Control Act. Remaining occurrences were of a minor nature.

Sec 222 of the Criminal Code states: "DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED." Every one who, while intoxicated or under the influence of a narcotic drug, drives a motor vehicle or has the care or control of a motor vehicle, whether it is in motion or not, is guilty of

(a) an indictable offence and is liable

(1) for a first offence, to imprisonment for not more than three months and not less than thirty days."

Sec. 222 of the Criminal Code states: "DRIVING WHILE ABILITY TO DRIVE IS IMPAIRED" Every one who while his ability to drive a motor vehicle is impaired by alcohol or a drug, drives a motor vehicle or has the care or control of a motor vehicle, whether it is in motion or not, is guilty of an indictable offence or an offence

punishable on summary conviction and is liable

(a) for a first offence, to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars and not less than fifty dollars or to imprisonment for three months or to both."
