First Hay Cutting Sets New Record in Halton

1966 was the year of a record first-cutting of hay in Halton County. The eight members of the High Yield Hay Competition, sponsored by the Halton Soil & Crop Improvement Association, had an average yield of 5,215 lbs. of hay, or just over 2.6 tons per acre. On a day matter basis this amounted to an average yield of 4,293 lbs. of dry matter.

The winner was Jim Reid, R. R. No. 2, Georgetown, with 5,874 lbs. of dry matter. His field of Alfalfa - Brome - Timothy mixture had been fertilized in the fall of 1965 with 300 lbs. of 20 per cent Superphosphate, and received 15 ton of manure per acre last winter. The hay harvested on June 20th yielded 196 bales per acre.

Others in the competition were: Harold Middlebrook, Milton R R 3, 5,044 lbs. dry matter; Gordon Thompson, Milton, R R 2, 4,674 lbs.; H. Craig Reid, Milton R R 6, 4,485; Russell Hurren, Campbellville, R R 2, 4,406; Fred Narsio, Georgetown R R 2, 3,753; Frank Robertson, Milton R R 5, 3,314; Don Matthews Acton R R 2, 2,796.

Because of the very dry July

and August, there was very little re-growth on many of these fields, and thus the second cutting was not considered in this Competition.

The results indicated that with a normal second cutting, good management of hay crop can provide yields of dry matter close or equal to that of corn silage.
