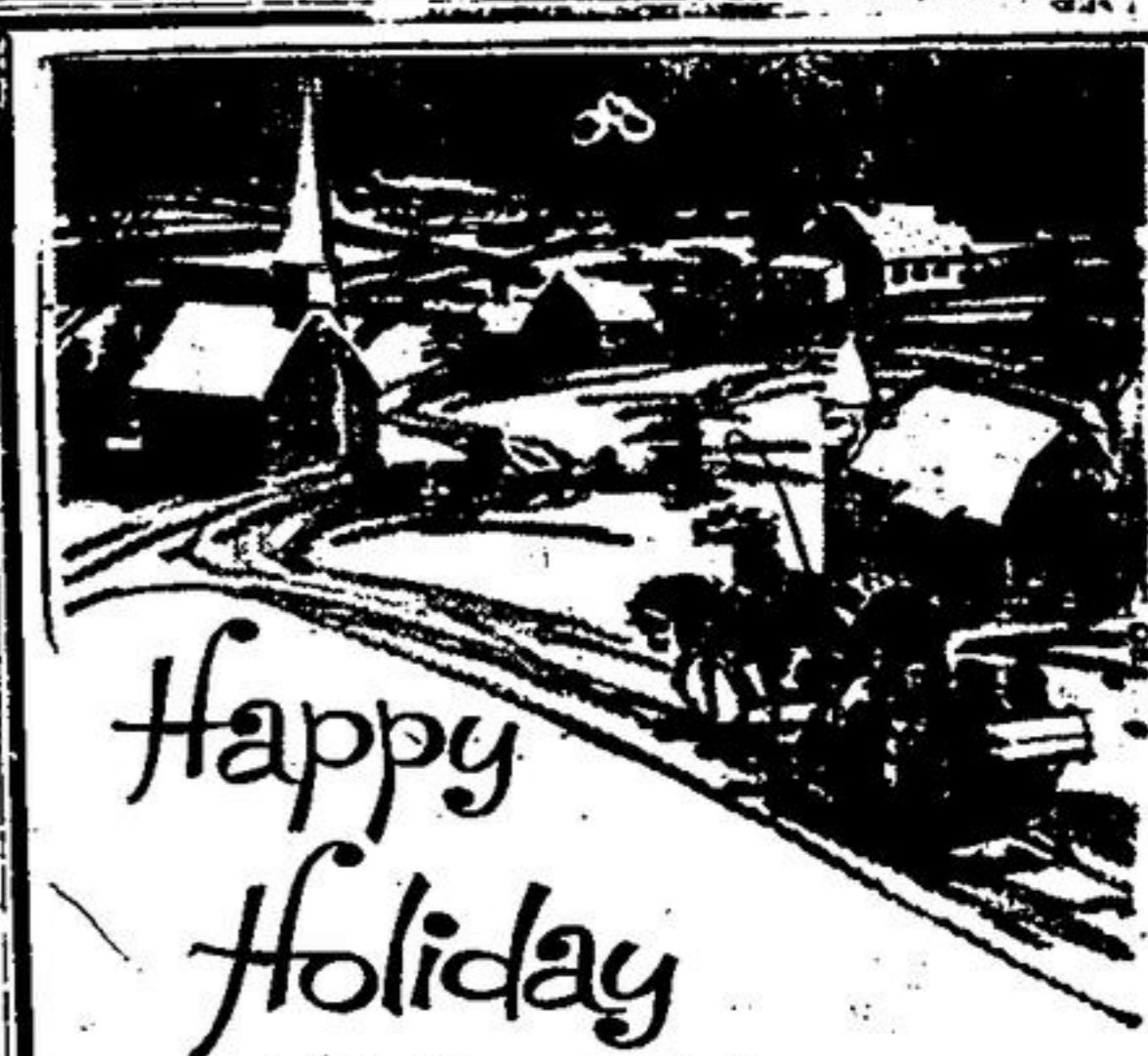

Many Cars are Damaged In Accidents in Town

A two-car collision at the Church St. - Market St. intersection was the most expensive of seven motor vehicle accidents investigated by Georgetown Police Department the first two weeks of the month.

The crash occurred Thursday, Dec. 8th and involved cars operated by Joseph Saxon, R.R. 3, and Mrs. Evelyn Holmes, 24 Maple Ave. W. Police said Saxon was driving south on Market St. and Mrs. Holmes was eastbound on Church St. when they hit at the intersection.

The impact swung the Holmes car onto Market St. where it came to rest facing south. The Saxon vehicle continued on after the collision through a hedge and over the Georgetown library lawn when it knocked down a sign.

P.C. Henry Vanderluis estimated the property damage as \$1,150 the 1964 Pontiac operated by Mrs. Holmes, \$350 to Saxon's 1958 Buick and \$50 to the library property. The accident happened at 6:55 p.m.

Robert Caldwell Kerr of R.R. 3, Acton, suffered bruises to his left leg when it was pinned between the door and running board of his truck in an accident Saturday.

It occurred on Market Street near the Legion when a car operated by W. Barclay, 21 MacKenzie Drive, backed out of a parking place on the west side of the street. The back end of the Barclay car caught Kerr as he was entering the truck.

A three car collision at 5:00 o'clock Saturday damaged cars operated by James Ewins, 75 McIntyre Cresc.; Janet Emmerson, 20 Guelph St., and Winston Weatherall, 15 Charles St.

According to police the Ewins and Emmerson cars were stopped on Guelph St. facing north while waiting to make a left turn to the Alley St. entrance to the downtown parking lot when Weatherall attempted to go past.

The collision pushed the Emmerson car into Ewins. P.C. Donaldson placed damage at \$600 to the front of Weatherall's 1968 Ford, \$250 to the 1963 Chrysler driven by Mrs. Emmerson and \$5 to Ewin's 1964 Ford.

Campbell Gate at Mountainview Road was the scene of an accident Thursday which did \$1000 damage to cars operated by Wilfrid James Hankey, 45 MacGillivray Cresc., and James William Bennett, 51 Sargent Road. Bennett suffered minor injuries.

Thursday, Dec. 1 at the corner of King and Mountainview. She was making a right turn off King St. onto Mountainview, when an eastbound car on Mountainview Road operated by Julian Joseph David collided with the back end. Police put property damage at \$750 to David's 1960 Pontiac, and \$250 to Mrs. Fendley's 1968 Chevrolet.
