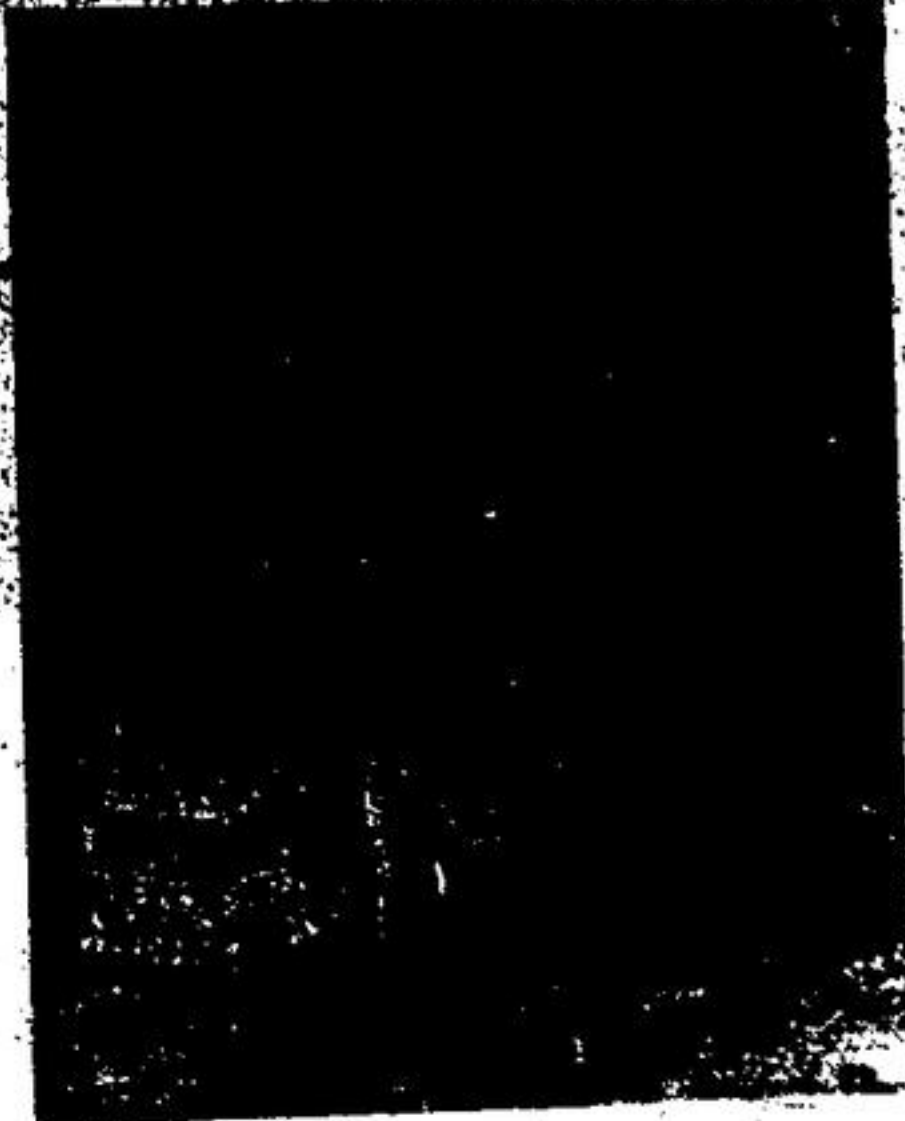


Boyes-Von Zuben Wedding Ceremony in Union Church
