**No Holiday for Accidents
 Eight is Week's Total**

Fate's whims in charge of
 traffic accidents didn't take a
 holiday during the past week,
 and consequently Georgetown
 police investigated eight motor
 vehicle accidents, one of them
 involving personal injury. Two
 of the crashes occurred Christ-
 mas day.

The most recent was a two-
 car collision on Monday Dec.
 26 at the corner of Windsor
 Rd. and Prince Charles Dr. in-
 volving cars operated by Alex-
 ander Donaldson, Prince Char-
 les Dr. and Adolf Thibodeau,
 29 Langstone Cresc. Police said
 Thibodeau was westbound on
 Prince Charles Dr. and making
 a left turn onto Windsor Rd.
 when the Donaldson car colli-
 ded with the rear end from be-
 hind. The street was ice coated
 at the time of the accident.

Cars driven by Jack Hall, 207
 Deltax Blvd. and John Neil
 Hardie, 18 Market St., collided
 at the same intersection on the
 afternoon of Christmas Day.
 Hall was northbound on Wind-
 sor Rd and Hardie westbound
 on Prince Charles Dr. according
 to police.

The Hall car continued on
 brushing a stop sign and strik-
 ing a tree on the north-west
 corner. At press time police
 had not estimated property
 damage.

Three hours earlier, Guelph
 St. and Maple Ave. was the
 scene of a two-car accident
 which did \$325 damage to late
 model cars operated by Nor-
 man R. Lockhurst, 21 King St. W.
 and Louis A. Bonnette, 1261
 Main St. N. Police said Lock-
 hurst was travelling east on
 the highway and Bonnette
 crossing south to north on
 Maple Avenue.

The Lockhurst car received
 the brunt of the damage, \$250
 worth.

A Christmas Eve accident
 did \$275 damage to a parked
 car owned by Veronica B.
 Firth, 9 Weber Dr., and an-

other vehicle operated by An-
 tlia C. Pascock, 18 Rexway Dr.
 Police said the Firth car was
 parked on the IGA plaza lot
 when the collision took place.
 Property damage was placed at
 \$175 to the Pascock car, and
 \$100 to the Firth car.

Earlier the same evening an
 accident at the Rexway Dr.,
 Deltax Blvd. intersection dam-
 aged cars operated by James
 Andrews, RR 1, Norval and
 Andrew Paul Tyler, 50 Prince
 Charles Dr. to the extent of
 \$350. Both cars were eastbound
 on Rexway Dr. when the An-
 drews car collided with the back
 end of the Tyler vehicle.

An accident on Friday Dec.
 23 did \$500 damage to cars driv-
 en by Vera R. Walker, 19
 Shelley St., and George Walker,
 Glassford, 9 Union St. Mrs.
 Walker was travelling east on
 Durban St. and Glassford was
 southbound on Union St. when
 they hit. The road was snow
 covered and slippery when the
 accident happened.

An Acton man, Donald Ed-
 ward Archibald, was driving
 north on Main St. Thursday
 night Dec. 22 when his car
 veered wide on the curve at
 the corner of Main and Guelph
 Sts., crossed the southbound
 lane and struck a tree at Henry
 St. Damage in this one was es-
 timated at \$450.

Two passengers were injured
 in a December 18 collision at
 midnight. Christina Dunham,
 24 Ontario St., was shaken up

and received a cut to her right
 eye; and Lorne Dewar, 1
 Joseph St. suffered a nose bleed
 when cars operated by Ken-
 neth Arthur Dunham and J.A.
 Gregg collided, at the corner
 of Guelph St. and Maple Ave.
 They were taken to Geor-
 getown District Memorial Hospi-
 tal by police ambulance.
 Police estimated the property
 damage at \$600.
