Georgetown Farmer Experiments In Hard-to-Raise Soybean Crop

During the past few years Soybeans have been growing in Halton County on a trial basis. Yields have been somewhat discouraging. Larry Pickett, RR 3, Georgetown, harvested 30 bushels per acre of Merit soybeans this year. M.M. Coles & Son, Acton, had a yield of 15 bushels per acre from Merit, and 10 bushels per acre with Crest. Unless yields of up to 30 bushels per acre can be obtained, it is very doubtful whether farmers can switch from their present crops, to Soybeans.

Weed control is very critical with this crop. Linuron applied just after the soybeans were planted, gave excellent weed control on both of these farms.

A new herbicide — Treflan — controlled weeds with the exception of Ragweed, thus it cannot be recommended for any areas where Ragweed is a problem.

Soybeans also respond well to soils of high fertility, thus they are usually sown in the rotation following the corn crop, where high amounts of fertilizer have been applied. You should not consider Soybeans on your farm unless you have high fertility, good weed control, and the proper harvesting equipment.

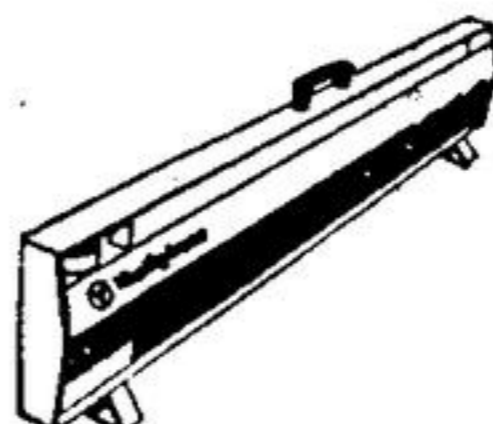
