

Raiders Seek Top Spot In Aurora Game Tonight

A goal by John Gould midway through the third period gave Aurora Tigers a 3-1 win over Georgetown Raiders in a crucial Suburban Junior C Hockey League game here Sunday afternoon.

Gould's goal broke a 1-1 tie that had existed since late in the first period. He put an insurance goal into the empty net with five seconds left to play as Tigers captured the 3-1 win.

The victory vaulted Aurora over Georgetown Raiders into first place in the six team loop. At press time Aurora has 36 points, one more than the second place Raiders, and the Tigers also have a game in hand.

Georgetown owned a 1-0 lead in the first period when defenseman Rod Presswood scored at 10:30 from Don Norton. That stood up until Whiddfield scored from Gould at 14:14.

Whiddfield passed to Gould for the winner after 37 minutes of scoreless play. The insurance goal was scored on a slider from the opposite end of the ice with Raiders pressing for the equalizer with six attackers.

Georgetown missed their chance to wrap the game up in the second period when Aurora was assessed 5 minor penalties. To Raiders' 2, Georgetown was tagged for 10 penalties and

Aurora 9. They included five minute majors to Raiders' Phil Lavell and Tigers' John Bray for a mild scrap in the third period.

A crowd of close to 900 witnessed the game.

Raiders and Tigers continue their battle for first place on Aurora's home ice tonight (Thursday). In three meetings to date Aurora has handed Raiders their only two defeats of the campaign, while Raiders have been the only club to spoil Aurora's unbeaten record.
