VARIAN GETS GOV'T. CONTRACTS WORTH \$2,000,000
A Georgetown firm, Varian Associates of Canada Ltd., has been awarded four contracts by the Department of Defence Production, it was announced by industry minister C. M. Drury.

Three of the contracts, valued at \$80,325, \$15,052 and \$10,142, are for the supply of electronic tubes. The fourth, valued at \$99,934, is for research.

A man who told police he tried to kill a Georgetown teenage girl was remanded on Monday to the Ontario Hospital for 30 days observation.

Magistrate Kenneth Langdon told the accused of Kitchener that if hospital reports indicated he knew what he was doing in attacking his former fiancée he would be brought back to court and arraigned on a charge of attempted murder.

The accused said he had picked up the 17 year old girl, a secretary, on January 5th, drove her two miles out of Georgetown and "tried to kill her."

He told police, "I hit her, I kicked her, I choked her. But she was too strong. I kicked her in the back, the stomach and in the head. If I had harder shoes I would have killed her — I was trying to."

Magistrate Langdon refused to convict on a charge of assault causing bodily harm.
