

NEW CHRISTIAN REFORMED CHURCH

Official Opening Planned Church Serves 621 People

The new Christian Reformed Church on the 7th Line of Esqueving will be officially opened February 10th, with town officials and the public invited to attend.

The congregation started ten years ago in Stewarttown Hall with thirty families, and has now reached one hundred and forty two families, or six hundred and twenty one persons.

From their first meeting place in Stewarttown hall, they moved to the Halton Trust Building on Main Street. (the old Georgetown Dairy building) Since the sale of that building to Halton and Peel Trust they have been meeting in the high school cafeteria, but will move into their own beautiful new church in another week.

At the beginning the congregation was served by Rev. Van

Harmelen, of Brampton, then Rev. Ralph Groeneboer of Acton. Their first resident minister was Rev. D. Loss, who stayed three years, then the present minister Rev. J. Joosse, who came four years ago.

The church was built by Vroom Construction, adjacent to the church school, the Georgetown Christian School.

Four years ago, Rev. James Joosse took over the leadership of the Christian Reformed Church on Main St. N. having served as minister of the church at Dresden for two and a half years.

He and his wife Lena, and their seven children, six sons and a daughter, live at 68 Main Street S. Both Mr. and Mrs. Joosse call Sarnia their home.

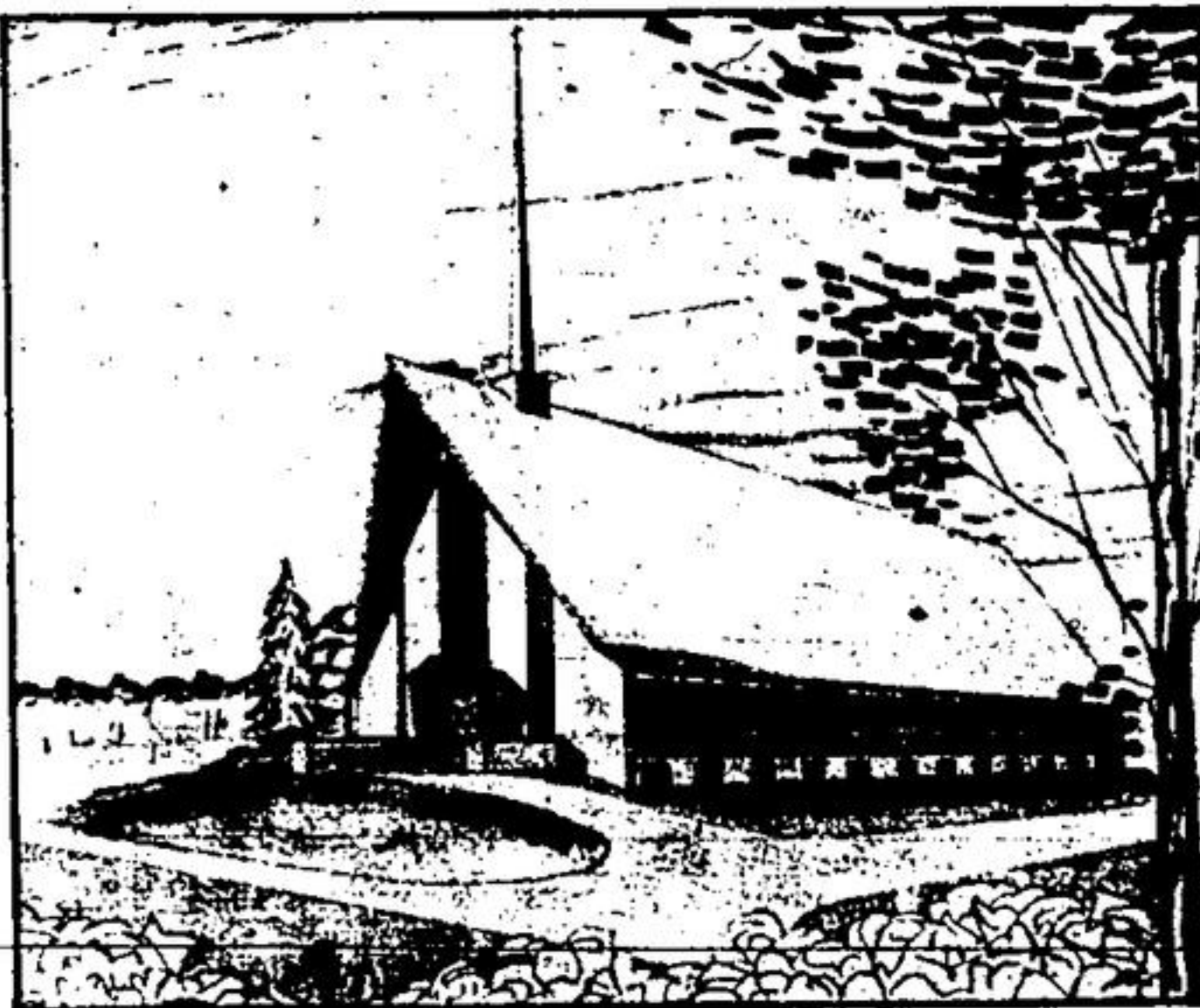
