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SCHOOL BOARD BRIEFS

Georgetown public school board, at a meeting in Harrison Public School Wednesday night:

Gave the nod to a travel project of Wigglesworth Public Principal William Kinrade. Mr. Kinrade will take approximately 44 Grade 8 pupils on a trip to Ottawa in late May.

Heard a recommendation from the teachers' council suggesting all public schools have a vice principal.

Agreed to look into the feasibility of advertising Georgetown in posters at teachers colleges as an aid to attracting top flight graduates.

Listened to a plea from principals concerned with the number of parents with a complain who call board members with their problems rather than contacting the principal's office. Trustees assured that in most cases callers were advised to get in touch with a principal.

Discussed the annual subject of accepting or not accepting payment available to the trustees briefly but shelved it until a time when all members are present. Senior members reiterated their stand on sitting on the board as a public service, but urged those elected in recent years to make up their own minds about receiving an honorarium. A ballot vote was proposed as the best way to decide the issue.
