

Fokkens Awarded Contract For High School Cleaning

The Georgetown District High School Board has let a contract to Halton and Peel Building Maintenance, a janitorial service operated by R. Fokkens, of McGillivray Cres., Georgetown.

Halton and Peel's bid of \$35,000 was one of five considered at a high school board meeting Monday Feb. 20, however the contract was not awarded until this week when the board held a special meeting.

The contract covers the period from March 21 to Dec. 31 of this year.

The board has spent several weeks in study and discussion on the advantages and disadvantages of operating their own janitorial service before giving the job to a bidder.

Committee's Plan Would Slow Down Farm Partitions

The recommendations from the committee suggested that the number of separations per 100 acres, be reduced to one every three years. At present one separation a year can be made from a one hundred acre parcel of land.

Cr. Tom Hill contended by shutting off growth they were also shutting off future assessment. "At what point do you break even between assessment and costs?" he wondered.

Clerk K.C. Lindsay guessed with one child going to school, the township broke even, any more and they didn't.

Cr. Hill maintained it was unfair to let people sell land if it is a subdivision, but not allow it if the lots are off a farm. "You're going to get kids from a subdivision too" remarked Cr. George Currie.

"If you let all the building go on" warned Cr. Pat Patterson, "you'll out-tax yourself."

"I think the farmer should be left alone to sell his lots if he wants to," contended Cr. Currie. "You're taking his rights away," chimed in Cr. Hill.

Council will meet with Committee of Adjustment chairman Ted Harrop.

Council set up a road committee consisting of the whole council. They will meet once a month to plan road expenditures, and projects.

"Maybe it will save us a lot of phone calls," said Cr. Tom Hill, who suggested it.

Comet marksmen were Harry Vandervoort (2), Richard Van Dyke, Abel Frankruyter, one a piece, Clarence Baker (2).

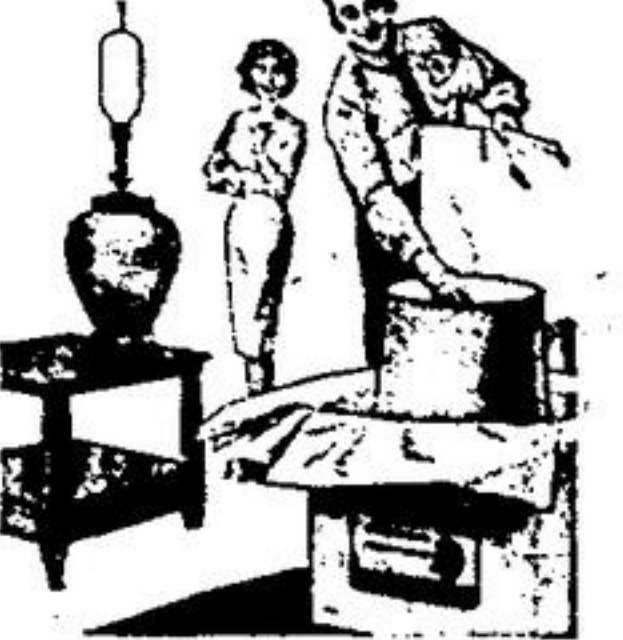
Clarence Kroll of Sun Life presented the Sun Life Cup to Georgetown Comets between the second and third period for topping the league in the regular schedule.
