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Speech Therapy Possible in Town Public Schools

Georgetown Public School board is taking a closer look at speech problems in the schools. He said speech problems tend to influence the pupils' reading and spelling abilities.

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At a meeting earlier this month school inspector O. G. McDowell told the trustees that a preliminary survey was conducted to find the extent of speech problems among the pupils. If 42 had speech problems considered serious, another 44 were not serious but would benefit from therapy, and another 14 cases were considered mild.

Mr. McDowell said a similar survey in Esquesing school indicated 68 pupils could use help.

"Some speech problems stem from malformations of the mouth, some from bad speech patterns developed at home," Mr. McDowell said.
