

Thirty Commercial Students Get Week-Long Taste of Business World

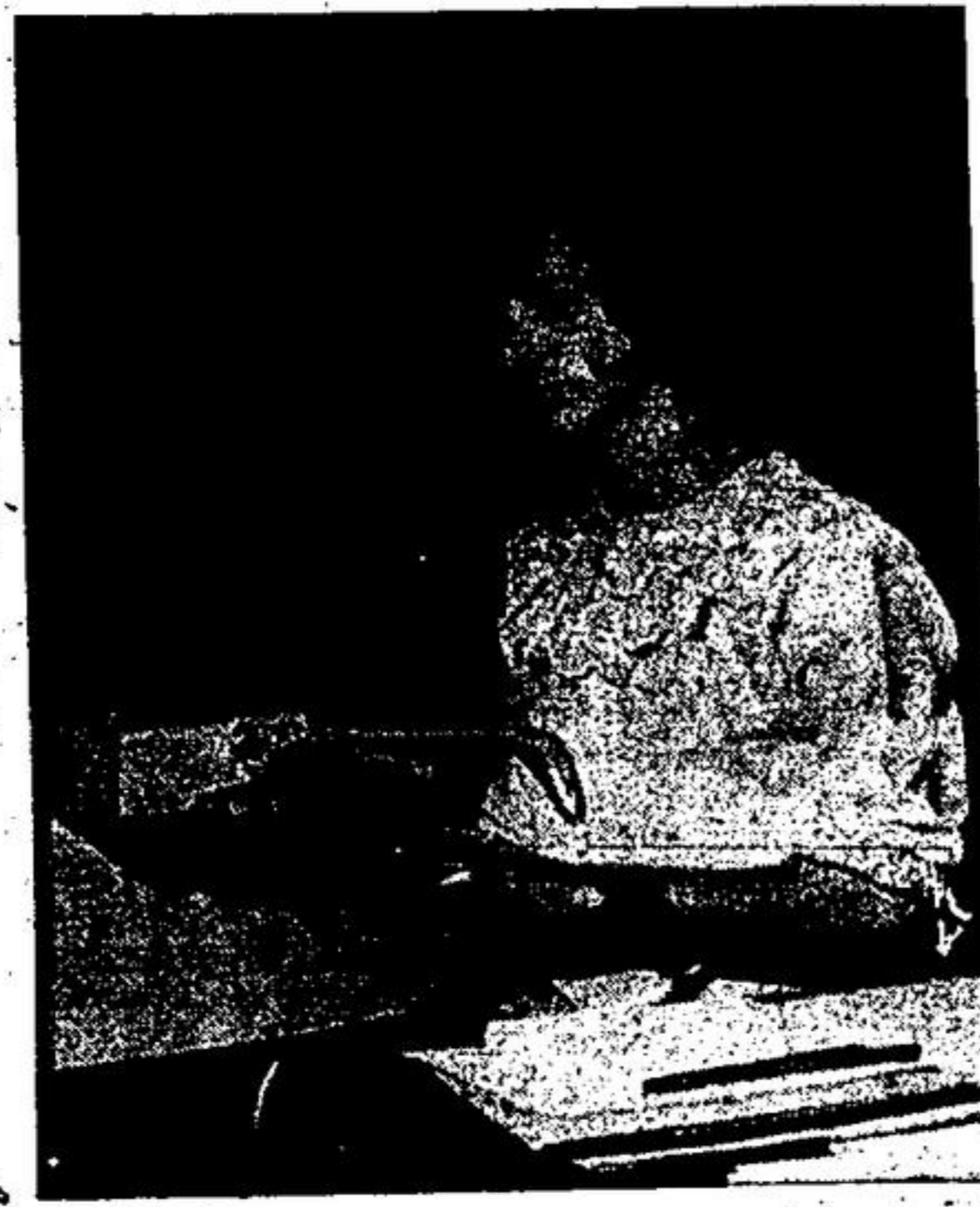
With a Georgetown Rotary idea and the cooperation of the Georgetown District High School, and many local businesses, 30 grade 12 Commercial students found out what work-

DID YOU KNOW

A revolutionary new procedure is allowing many amputees to walk again within 24 hours after surgery. Developed by a Polish surgeon the new process provides that a temporary artificial leg be fitted immediately at the time of amputation. Patients are up and around the day after the amputation, rather than having to wait several months as they do under traditional amputation procedures.

Refuses Time to Pay Liquor Fines

Two Georgetown district teens are in the county jail today after a Toronto Magistrate refused to allow the 17 year olds time to pay their fines when they appeared before him on charges of drinking while under age.

The Georgetown youth was fined a total of \$60 on two convictions. Local police filed the liquor charges after he was found staggering down steps at Georgetown Arena on March 10, and again when he was found to be drinking during a dance at Oddfellows' Hall the next night.
