

TODAY IN HISTORY

March 29, 1967 . . .
 The great basilica of Ste. Anne de Beaupre was destroyed by fire 45 years ago today—in 1922—at a total loss of \$1,200,000. Its temporary replacement was also burned down four years later. Ste. Anne, 21 miles northeast of Quebec, was first settled in 1657 and Breton sailors built a chapel there the following year in thanks for salvation from shipwreck. The new basilica, high above the St. Lawrence River, is visited by hundreds of thousands of Catholic pilgrims yearly.
 1848—The Niagara River was nearly dry below an ice jam in Lake Erie.
 1886—The Hickson royal commission on liquor published its finding that prohibition laws did not affect liquor consumption.
 First World War
 Fifty years ago today—in 1917—British cavalry occupied villages near Bertin-court and St. Quentin; the German Socialist party voted against the government's emergency budget in the Reichstag.
 Second World War
 Twenty five years ago today—in 1942—an Empire Day of Prayer was held; Gen. A. G. L. McNaughton returned to Britain from Canada; Sir Stafford Cripps announced in New Delhi he had offered dominion status to the Indian nationalists.

Canada: Bad Way To Beat Draft

WASHINGTON (AP-CP)—An expert said recently that of the ways to beat the draft in the United States, going to Canada is the worst.
 Burke Marshall, chairman of President Johnson's draft reform group, said anyone can beat the draft.
 He was testifying before a Senate Labor subcommittee hearing on an expected extension of the military draft.
 Democratic Senator Edward M. Kennedy, chairman of the subcommittee, asked about young men escaping the draft by moving to Canada.
 Marshall said any youth with the will, the means and the intelligence can beat the draft.
 He outlined some of the ways, including entering college, getting a job that has an occupation deferment and getting married and becoming a father.
 "All of these are like means of tax avoidance. They are legitimate but they are bad for our democratic country.
 "Going to Canada is worse."
