



FORTY-EIGHT TONS OF FILLINGS DISAPPEAR IN ROAD CAVITIES

Forty eight tons of cold mix have disappeared into the potholes in the town roads, and another truck load arrived Tuesday. This unusually high amount of cold mix is due to the alternate freezing and thawing, says road superintendent Frank Morette.

Missing Two Months Find Body in Snowbank

The frozen body of Philip Charlton, the missing Milton diabetic, was found Saturday half-hidden in a snowbank on a mountain trail near Rattle-snake Point.

Two armed services cadets from Toronto stumbled across the corpse at noon, during a mock war exercise on the Niagara Escarpment.

John Power, 22, Army Militia of Booth Avenue, and Wayne Burns, 22, Air Cadets, of Lake Crescent, told of the amazing circumstances which led to their bizarre discovery.

The escarpment in the Rattle-snake Point area involved over 200 police and Army personnel. Scuba divers had already searched the lakes in the area.

Heavy snows impeded the exercise and it was called off after four hours.

Mr. Charlton, a 55-year-old factory worker of John Street, Milton, was reported missing during the last week in January. An autopsy was held Sunday and an inquest may be held later.

Surveying Area

"We were surveying the area as a reconnaissance patrol sent out to establish a headquarters at a given point on our map," said John.

"When we got to the spot we were looking at land conditions," Wayne added.

"All of a sudden we found this hump in the snow and John said: 'look, there's a body!' It was right on our map reference."

The pair indicated an 'X' marked on their map.

"That was where we were to set up our headquarters," said Wayne.

"And that was where we found the body," added John. "It was quite a shock to us both."

Back Showing

"They said only Mr. Charlton's back was showing from the hard snow bank."

"We dug it out a little bit and saw it was a body," said Wayne. "We ran to the nearest farmhouse and telephoned the police."

The pair were involved in a war game exercise with about 10 other members of three Toronto Squadrons of the Reserve.

The body was found just 660 feet from where Mr. Charlton's snow-covered car was found abandoned at the northern dead-end of the Walker's Line.

An intensive search for Mr. Charlton was planned by Milton O.P.F. for Sunday. The search was to have been aided by Halton Auxiliary Police Force and local farmers who knew the area.
