

Concelebration Marks Father Zeno's 25 Years in Priesthood

It seems the whole parish of Holy Cross Church joined in celebrating the Silver Jubilee of Father Zeno Deroo.

The High Mass, at 3 p.m., was offered by six priests in concelebration (a first in Georgetown) and one deacon. Three brothers were also present in the Sanctuary. All were conferees of Fr. Zeno, members of the Capuchin Order. Father V. J. Morgan, of Acton, a former pastor here, was also present in the church. After the Mass the Fathers and Parishioners gathered in the auditorium for further festivities.

The hall was effectively decorated with silver chains, medals, etc., and hanging over the stage, the words "God Bless you on your Silver Jubilee Anniversary."

The program, chaired by Mr. M. Michalski, started by the choir singing three sections, "Jubilate," "Auralee" and "I Must Sing."

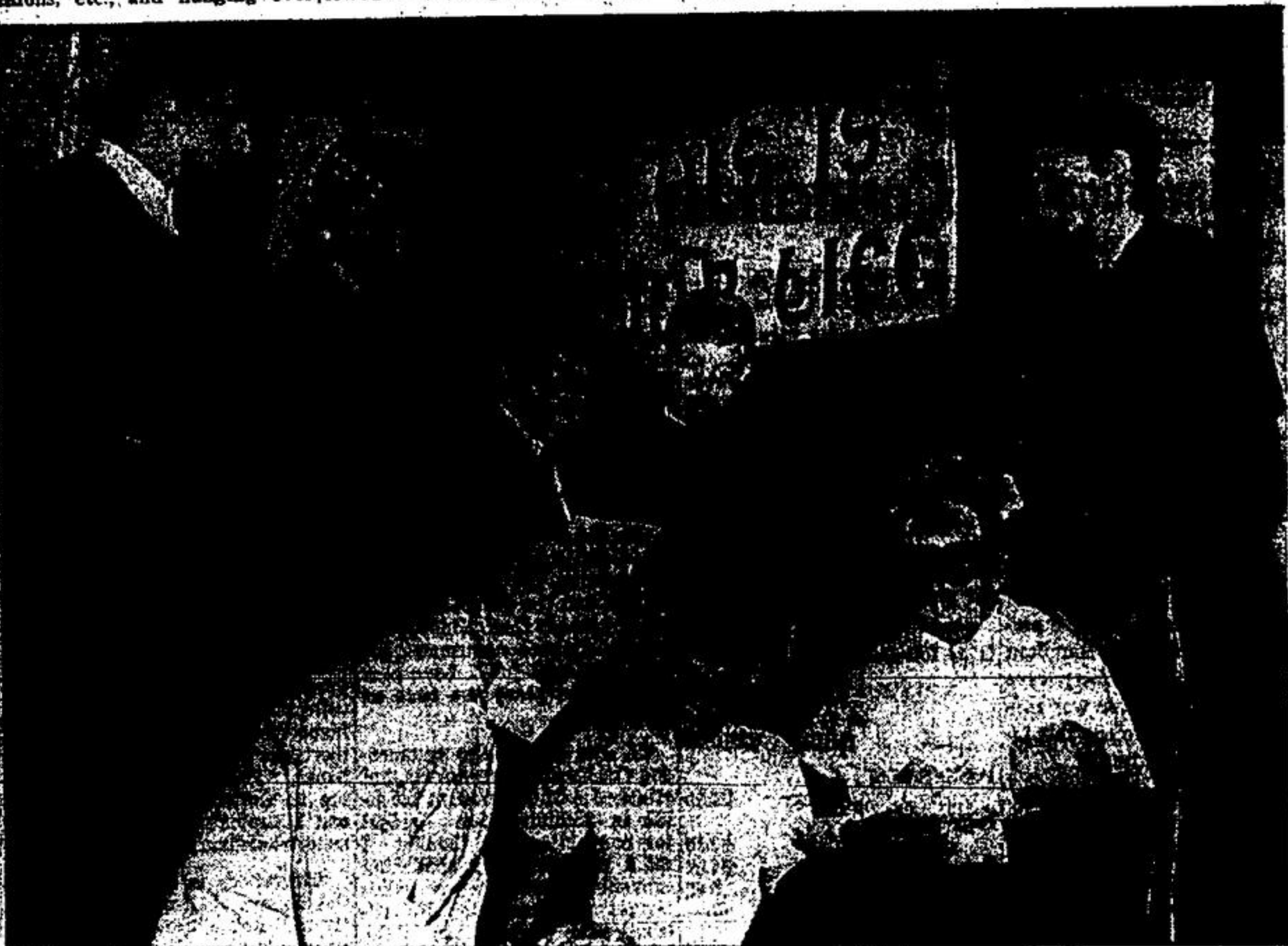
Then followed a series of very short sketches entitled "This Is Your Life," planned and executed by Mrs. Landry. These were incidents in the life of Fr. Zeno, re-enacted by some of the school children.

Wants Boost in County Expenditures on Roads

County engineer W.J. Corbett revealed that Halton County Council's roads expenditure was only about half that of Peel county.

Answering a charge by Halton Crown Attorney Peter McWilliams that council was penny-pinching on the roads' expenditure, Mr. Corbett said: "The expenditure is about half that of Peel County. We are trying to get it up and we hope to get the mill rate raised over the next few years to something like it ought to be."

He said council spent around \$1,200,000 gross on the roads program in 1966 and had budgeted for about \$100,000 more this year.
