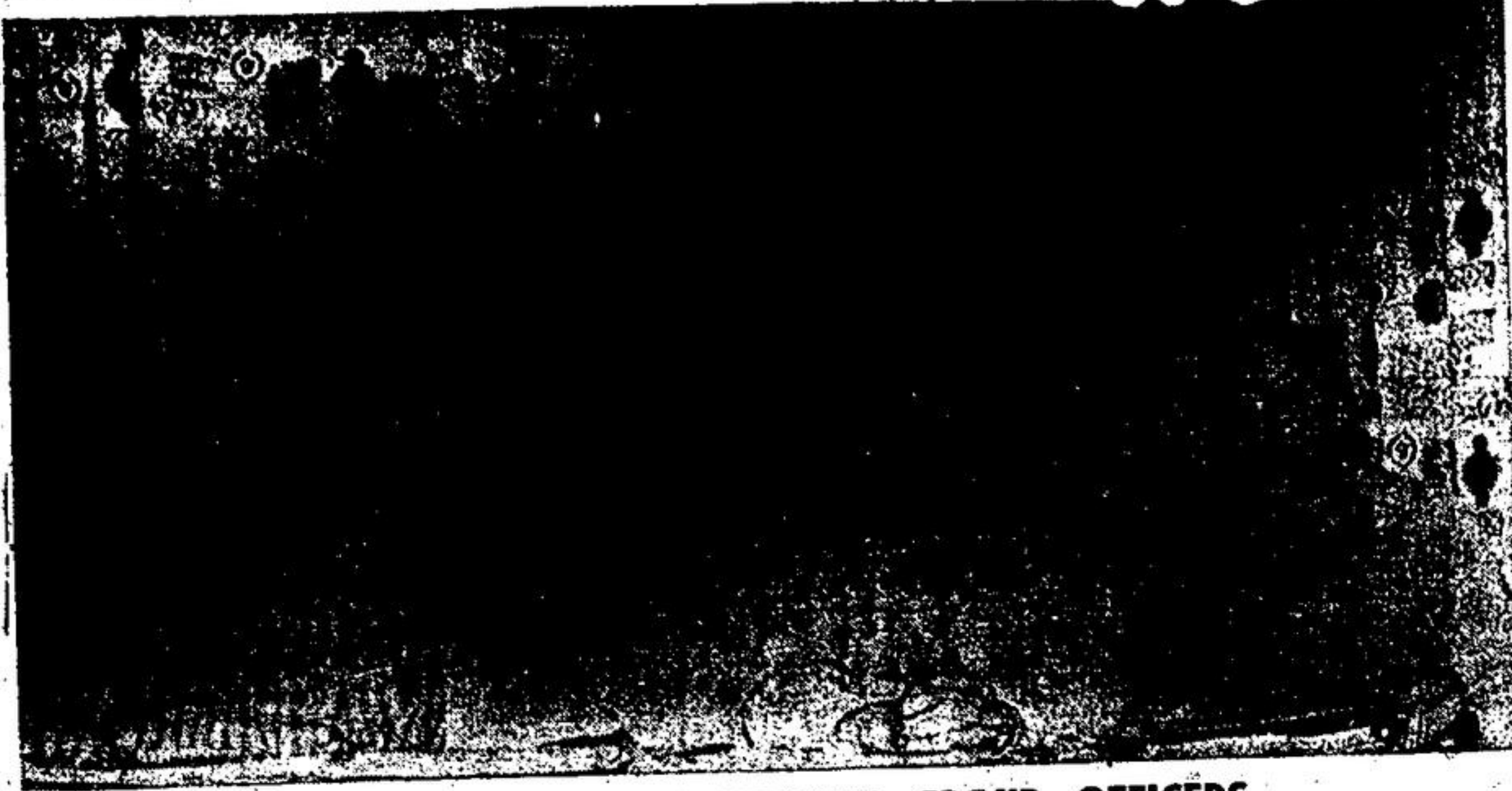

Baseball Tips

If You Want To Be A Catcher Memorize This

This week I shall write about the other duties of the catcher.

1) Receiving:

(a) Get a catcher's mitt to your liking and break it in to fit your hand. Have your new mitt breaking in all the time since it takes awhile to gain confidence in it to use in a game.

(b) Learn to catch with one hand and use the glove hand smoothly and quickly. Do not be a one hand catcher, but there will be pitches you can handle easier with just the mitt.

(c) Receive the ball instead of fighting it. Keep wrists relaxed and give slightly with the catch.

2) Give a good target for pitcher:

(a) Do not drop target just when the pitcher is releasing the ball for that is when he needs

from target to ball.

(b) To prevent getting tied-up in a crouch position turn mitt under while giving low target.

3) Learn to catch pop flies:

(a) Determine direction of wind and sun before the game begins.

(b) Keep the ball slightly in front of you since you can go forward much quicker than backward. Catch flies with glove face up.

(c) On pop flies straight up over the home plate area, do not move until you have it properly judged, then move slowly for position to make the catch.

4) Learn to protect your fingers:

(a) Do not point your fingers straight toward the pitcher when in the act of receiving the ball.

The Club will open the season at the Pitches in Georgetown Park on Wednesday night, May 10 at 7 p.m. May 10th and May 17th will be warm up nights and any newcomers to Georgetown or anyone interested in playing Horseshoes can be assured of a hearty welcome.

The schedule will start on Wednesday, May 24th at 7:00 p.m. It is essential that the Committee have the names of all former members who wish to play this year at least one week before the schedule starts.

The membership fee is \$2.00 per member and this includes both team play and singles.

The Canadian Horseshoe championship as well as the North American Horseshoe championship will be held at the Canadian National Exhibition this year on Friday and Saturday, August 18th and 19th.
