

General Fireproofing's Earnings, \$1.05 Per Share

Net earnings of The General Fireproofing Company for the first quarter of this year rose to \$1,263,135, or \$1.05 per share, an increase of 63.3 per cent over the \$773,580, or 64 cents per share in the like period last year.

Sales of the business furniture and equipment manufacturer for the three months totalled \$20,423,551, highest for any quarter in the company's 65 year history. This is a 24.3 per cent increase over 1966 first quarter sales of \$16,432,612.

GF's results for the quarter represent an increase of 22.2 per cent in sales and 56.4 per cent in earnings over the previous year, said president John A. Saunders.

New office building construction to accommodate the steadily increasing number of white collar workers will be a major source of future business, along with the office furniture replacement market, Mr. Saunders said.

Manufacturing operations are being started at GF's newly constructed plant in Georgetown, serving the Canadian market. Additional facilities are being built at the company's plants in Forest City, N.C. and Ellicottville, N.Y. Structural steel has been erected for a new 150,000 square foot plant at Sturgis, Mich. for manufacturing business and institutional seating marketed by the Sturgis Company, a GF subsidiary.
