Public School Board Cool To Full Rotation System

A full rotary class system is not likely to be introduced into public schools here in the near future unless Georgetown Public School trustees discover some hidden value that they haven't been made aware of.

A rotary system is the high school method of teaching in which the classes change rooms for each period.

At present the Centennial Public School, Georgetown's only senior school for pupils of grades 7 and 8, operates on a semi-rotary system, with classes in home rooms for the morning and rotating during the afternoon.

Centennial principal William French wrote a letter to the school board a month ago proposing the morning classes also be rotated. He claimed pupils benefit because teachers are able to put more time on the particular subject he or she is teaching. A full rotary system would mean the elimination of recess from the school day, which Mr. French said he felt were unnecessary.

Trustees at the April meeting said they would like to find out opinions on the full rotary system in public schools before acting on the request. They were, however, cool to the idea of a no-recess school day, which some trustees said provided a necessary break for the pupil.

At the May board meeting Wednesday they got some opinions. O.G. McDowell, inspector of public schools for this area, told trustees he had been gathering opinions from principals in other Ontario communities where the semi-rotary schools exist and enthusiasm for a full-rotary system hadn't been apparent.
