THE CORPORATION OF THE

TOWN OF GEORGETOWN

By-Law No. 67-19

A By-Law to provide for the early closing of barbers' shops in the Town of Georgetown.

WHEREAS By-Law No. 428 as amended by By-Law No. 457 as amended by By-Law No. 57-59 was enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown to provide for the early closing of barbers' shops;

AND WHEREAS Council now deems it expedient and necessary to make certain changes in the provisions aforesaid and to that end has decided to repeal the said by-laws;

AND WHEREAS by virtue of Section 379a of the Municipal Act, RSO 1960 Chapter 330, as amended, the Council of a municipality may provide for the early closing of certain shops within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS it is the declared intention of Council that any section or part of a section of this By-Law which may subsequently be held to be illegal shall be severable from the remainder of the By-Law and shall not be deemed to have persuaded or influenced the Council to pass the remainder of the By-Law.

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The provisions of this By-Law shall apply only to barbers' shops.

2. For the purposes of this By-Law the word 'holiday' means and the word 'holidays' includes:

- (a) Sunday
- (b) New Year's Day
- (c) Good Friday
- (d) Easter Monday
- (e) Victoria Day
- (f) Dominion Day
- (g) the first Monday in the month of August
- (h) Labour Day
- (i) Christmas Day
- (j) Boxing Day
- (k) any day appointed by the proclamation of the Governor-General of Canada or the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Ontario as a public holiday for the Province of Ontario.

3. Barbers shops shall be closed on holidays.

4. Subject to paragraph three of this by-law, barbers' shops in the Town of Georgetown shall be and remain closed on each day of each week at and during any time or hours as follows:

(a) from 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Tuesday to 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon on the following Wednesday;

(b) from 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Wednesday to 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon on the following Thursday;

(c) from 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Thursday to 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon on the following Friday;

(d) from 9:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Friday to 8:30 o'clock in the forenoon on the following Saturday;

(e) from 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Saturday to 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon on the following Tuesday;

5. Subject to paragraph three of this By-Law but notwithstanding any other provision of this By-Law to the contrary, barbers' shops may remain open:

(a) from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon on any day immediately preceding any holiday as defined by paragraph two of this By-Law if such holiday does not fall on a Sunday or Monday;

(b) from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon to 9:00 o'clock in the afternoon on any of the seven days immediately preceding December 25th.

6. So long as the time commonly observed in the Town of Georgetown is one hour in advance of Standard Time, the times mentioned in this By-Law shall be reckoned in accordance with the time so commonly observed and not in accordance with standard time.

7. Any person convicted of a breach of any provision of this By-Law shall forfeit and pay at the discretion of the convicting magistrate a penalty not exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), exclusive of costs and such penalty is recoverable under and in accordance with the provisions of The Summary Convictions Act.

8. Upon this By-Law coming into force, By-Law No. 428 as amended by By-Law No. 457 as amended by By-Law 57-59 shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
