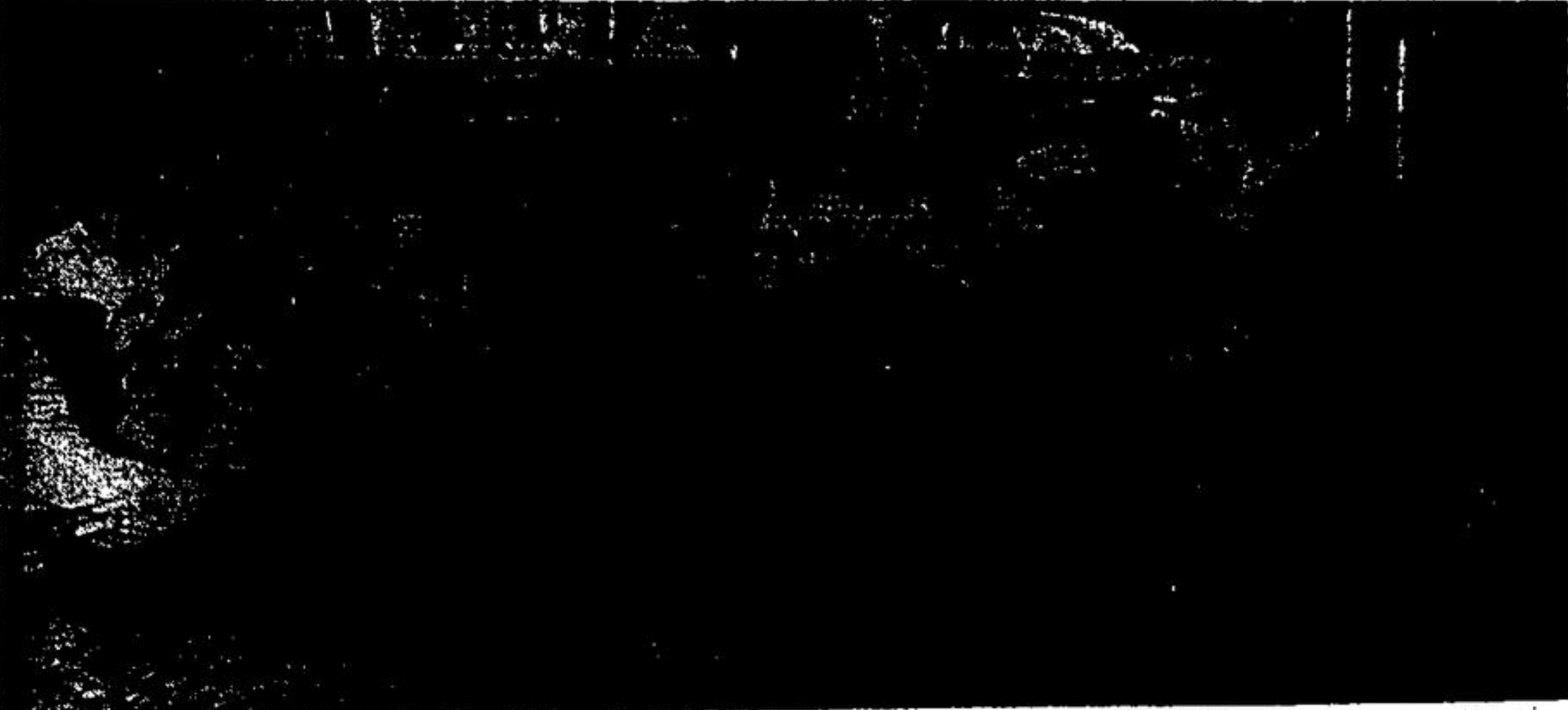


TOWN, GLEN RIVALS ON THE FASTBALL DIAMOND

Milton scored three more in the 5th on 2 straight walks, triple, and a wild throw. Roy Maltis started for the local team and was replaced after a disastrous fifth by Al Whitham who went the rest of the way with no difficulty.

A former member of the Georgetown Minor Baseball League executive, Bill Anderson, of 44 Delrex Blvd., is almost single handedly keeping the minor baseball house league from disappearing from the Georgetown sports scene.

Two weeks ago the league, which annually provides organized baseball for some 200 local boys, had breathed its last after seven years of operation. Today there is hope that it will operate for an eighth season.

Mr. Anderson made a plea for assistance in an ad last week and drew sufficient response to at least make an attempt to launch a 1967 season. He has called for boys between 8 and 12 years-of age as of January to register at the Georgetown Park Saturday from 10 a.m. to 12:30.
