**Boer, First War Vets are Guests at Legion Function**

Tuesday evening, Branch 20, Canadian Legion, entertained veterans of the first world war and a survivor of the Boer war at an evening in their honor. This was held in connection with the National Veterans' Week, held June 11th to 17th. The Monday previous a night had been held honouring the men responsible for keeping the Saturday morning hockey

running so successfully. At the Old Vets Night a dinner was served for some twenty six present. The Legions had found the names of forty five in Georgetown and district, and all had replied, but naturally the health of men in that age group precluded many from attending. Some five were in hospital, ten were confined to their homes with illness, so it was considered a remarkably fine turnout.

The evening was marked by the unusual fact that there were no speeches, except a welcoming speech from the Veterans' Week chairman, Dave Bowman, who welcomed the men on behalf of the branch, and thanked the second war vets who came up to help make the evening a success.

An interesting feature was the attendance of two Charter members who attended the 1st meeting when the Canadian Legion was formed forty years ago in the fall of 1928. A third surviving member of the group G. O. Brown was unable to be present. The two men were Dr. C. V. Williams and Jim Murphy. Dr. Williams is a Military Cross holder and Mr. Murphy holds the Croix De Guerre.

**Now Minister At Shallow Lake**



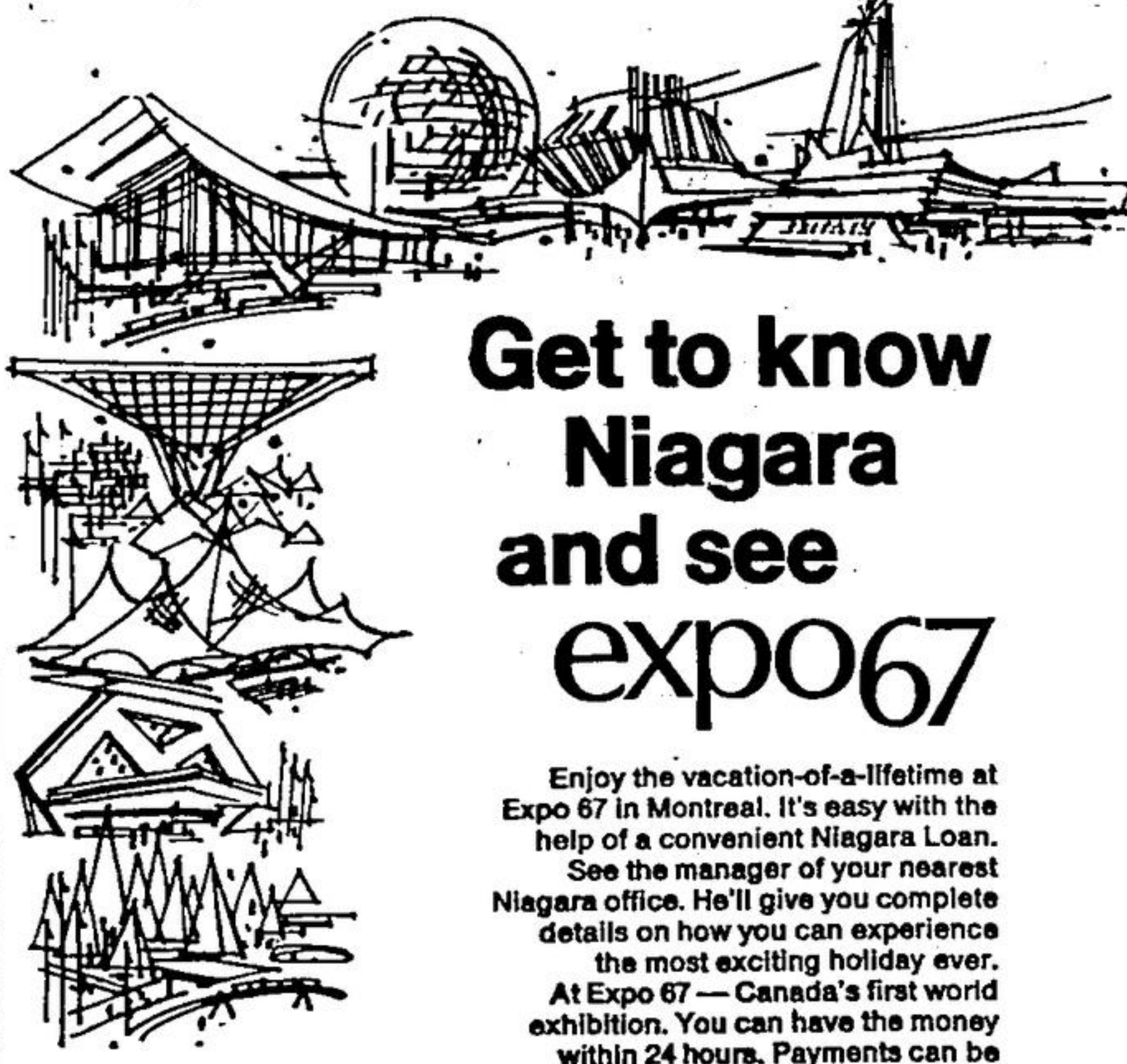
REV. GEORGE BATES

**Police Corporal to Receive Compensation**

A letter from the assistant secretary of the Workmen's Compensation Board notified council that medical evidence supported the view that the injuries to Ted Scott's back were definitely related to an accident in June 30, 1960, when he was on the town force.

Deputy Reeve Arthur Speight commented, "This is the end of the fight to have Mr. Scott receive compensation." He told council two surgeons had voluntarily driven in from Guelph and Oakville respectively to testify. The deputy reeve said "the Workmen's Compensation Board simply want to know if we have any objections".

Council had no objections and were pleased Mr. Scott would be recompensed.
