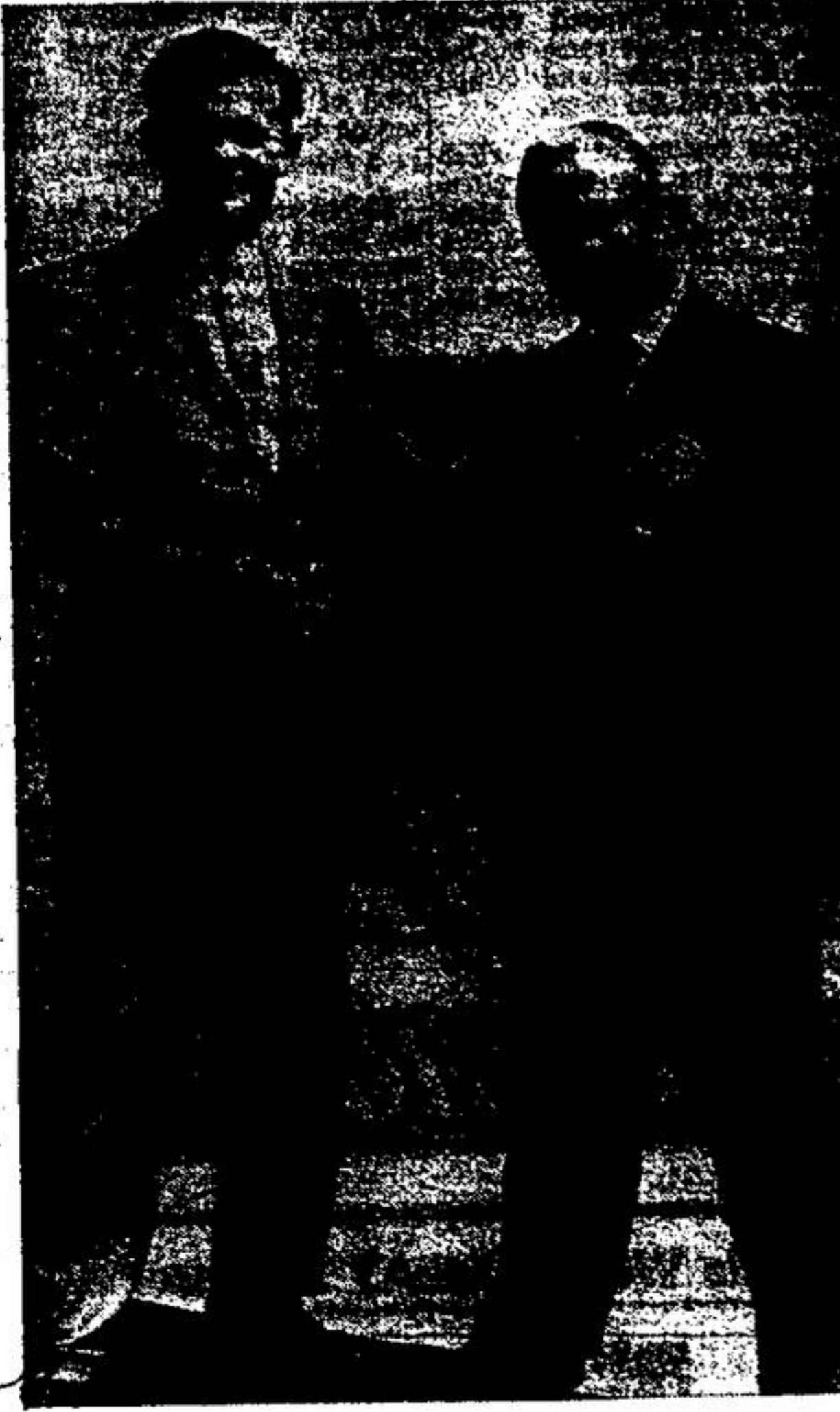


# Dennison Official Opening Thursday

A ribbon cutting ceremony Thursday morning marks the official opening of the new distribution centre of Dennison Manufacturing Company of Canada, Ltd.

The 35,000 square foot plant, built by McNally Construction on Todd Road, centralizes merchandise distribution for the firm which has its manufacturing operations in Drummondville, Quebec.

At a later date, the firm plans to manufacture some of its products in Georgetown also, according to A.J. (Jim) Matthews, who came from Quebec as manager at Georgetown when the plant opened recently.

Mr. and Mrs. Matthews are living in Glen Williams.

The Dennison firm manufactures a wide range of products including crepe paper, shipping tags, gift wrapping paper, gummed labels and paper napkins. The distribution centre here will serve the entire Ontario selling market.

The firm has located in Georgetown's eastern industrial area, purchasing ten acres which had been acquired by the town from Delrex Developments Ltd.

Following the official ceremony at the plant this morning, the firm will host civic leaders and business associates at a luncheon at North Halton Golf and Country Club.

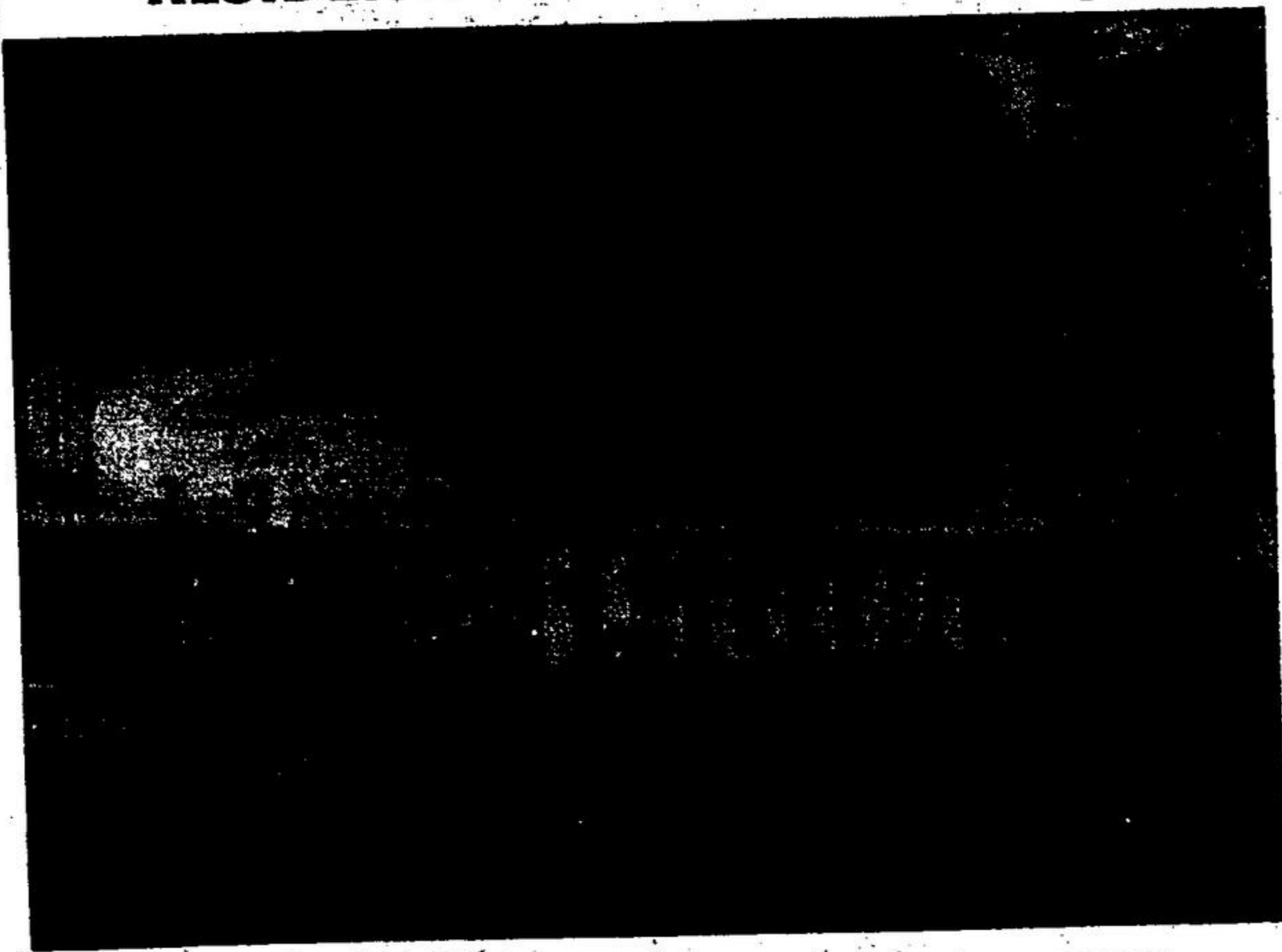
