SALUTES THE FATHERS OF CONFEDERATION

They gathered at Quebec City in October of 1864 - delegates from Upper and Lower Canada, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland -- and in less than three weeks they completed the blueprints for a federation of British provinces that would stretch its bounds within seven years to the borders of three oceans.

The Quebec conference was the second to be held in two months: In September the provincial delegates had met at Charlottetown. There they had agreed on the basic principle of forming a British North American federation. At Quebec they worked out the details, and the plan thye came up with became, almost word for word, the British North America Act of 1867.

Written by the delegates at Quebec, the B.N.A. Act became law when it was passed by the British Parliament, and signed by Queen Victoria on March 29, 1867. So, in a sense, the British Parliamentarians who argued and voted for the bill were also Fathers of Canadian Confederation. So too were the provincial lieutenant-governors who used their - Influence with the Colonial Office to advance the Canadian plans.

Of the official Fathers - the men gathered around the table in the famous William Notman photograph of the Quebec Conference - some of them never lived to see their province join the Confederation whose constitution they had helped to write. Some changed their minds after the Conference and tried to keep their provinces out of the new union.

But all of these men were the founders of modern Canada, and in this Centennial year we at Silver's are proud to pay tribute to them.
