**Practice Livestock Judging Prepare For Competition**

On Monday, June 26 most of the 4-H Livestock Club members attended the Practice Livestock Judging Night, held at the farms of Joe and John Willmott and Maurice Beaty.

At 7:15 p.m. members commenced judging a class of Aberdeen Angus heifers, followed by a class of sheep. At the second stop, Maurice Beaty's farm, members judged two classes of Jersey cows. Following the judging, reasons were given in the Agricultural Hall, at Milton Fair Grounds, with the 4-H Club leaders in charge.

This practice evening is held annually in preparation for the County Livestock Judging Competition to be held on Wednesday, July 19th, at the University of Guelph. At this competition members are divided into groups according to previous participation in such an event, novice, junior and senior. Novices are those who have not previously competed, juniors are under 16 years of age, and seniors are 16 and over. Prize money is awarded, as well as challenge trophies for beef, dairy, swine and sheep judging.

In addition a Champion Livestock Judging Trophy is awarded for the over all county champion. This competition is compulsory to all senior 4-H club members of the 4-H Calf and Sheep Clubs.

**Burlington Lawyer is Former Halton Attorney**

Lloyd Denham Dingle, Q.C. Burlington lawyer and a former Crown Attorney for Halton County, died on Wednesday, July 12, at the Henderson General Hospital in Hamilton.

Mr. Dingle succeeded the late W. I. Dick, Q.C., as Crown Attorney in 1949, and held the office for several years. In 1937 he was Progressive-Conservative candidate for Halton in the provincial election.

Mr. Dingle is survived by his wife, a son, Denham V. Dingle of Streetsville, and a daughter, Mrs. S.D.M. Vickers of Prince Albert, Saskatchewan. The funeral was Saturday from Burlington Baptist Church.

Well, how does it feel to be 100 years old? Exciting, isn't it, all the celebration, fun and excitement marking Centennial Year? I hope all of you had a great July 1 celebration and also that you are able to enjoy many of the special events seemingly going on everywhere in the country this year. It almost appears as though Canada and Canadians have rediscovered that fun is contagious. It should be a lively, exciting and friendly road towards our 200th year.

We in Bell Canada are also celebrating a new milestone this month. Late in June the 5 millionth telephone went into service somewhere in our Quebec or Ontario territory. It hardly seems possible that just four years after we added our 4 millionth telephone this new record has been set. After all it did take 65 years to reach the one million mark. From 1880, when The Bell Telephone Company of Canada was founded, until April, 1945. Since then the "millionth" milestones have come with increasing swiftness. Four million telephones in just 22 years. We feel that this rapid growth of telephones in our territory reflects the vitality and ever-expanding development of the two provinces. For 14 of those 22 years Canadian have held the title of the "world's talkingest people." Perhaps that is partly the results of Bell Canada's efforts in helping Canadians bridge the miles for most of our country's 100 years. No special celebrations marked the installation of the 5 millionth telephone. In fact, we have no idea which home or office in our territory can claim the honor. You could be using it, however, if you had a telephone installed late last month.

You may have noticed that for the past several months Telephone News, the small insert that arrives with your account has been carrying a message about the Area Codes in different parts of Canada. As you know, Canada and the United States have been divided up into more than 100 Areas, each assigned its own distinct Area Code. Here in Georgetown our Area Code is 416. Although someone else in another community on the continent may have the same telephone number as you, when your number is prefixed by your Area Code it becomes unique over the entire telephone network. Using the Area Code when you call Long Distance speeds your messages easily across the miles. For instance, where Direct Distance Dialing is available, you can dial your own Long Distance calls. Where calls must be placed through an Operator, giving her the Area Code as well as the distant number helps her to speed your call. The front pages of your telephone directory contain Area Codes for many places on the continent.
