Most Fatal Accidents on Queen Elizabeth Highway

Almost one third of Halton County's fatal accidents last year involved collisions between two motor vehicles. Most fatal accidents occurred on Queen Elizabeth Way.

But the two high figures are not related. Not a single QEW fatality in 1966 involved a two-car crash-up.

The seven two-vehicle accidents included three double fatalities for a total toll of ten lives. In addition, two motorcyclists, died in separate accidents when their machines were hit by cars.

In all, 27 persons died on Halton County highways last year in 22 accidents. The statistics come from crown attorney Peter McWilliams' annual report.

Of thirteen fatal accidents involving only one vehicle, five took the lives of five pedestrians. A sixth pedestrian, an 18 year old hitchhiker died in one of the two-car accidents.

The eight remaining single-vehicle accidents were evenly divided as to those involving no collision, and those involving collision with a fixed object.

Teenage Girl

Two of the four no-collision accidents brought death to inexperienced drivers. In one, a 19-year-old girl driving on a temporary instruction permit lost control on a curve. Her Volkswagen rolled, throwing her out.

An inexperienced 17-year-old male motorist lost control while passing a transport truck and rolled his 1960 Corvair in the median. He too was thrown from the car.

The four fatal collisions with fixed objects included one fantastic coincidence. Two cars, on March 4th, one on November 18th, killed their drivers at the identical spot — the forked end of a guard rail on the Queen Elizabeth Way median.

The concrete railing of a Highway 403 overpass took another life on April 23, while a concrete bridge abutment on Lakeshore Road East claimed the lives of three women on November 13.

Pigeonholing fatal accidents by location, Queen Elizabeth Way took pride of place in the grim list with six.

Highway 401

Next came Highway 401 with four fatal accidents and the Lakeshore Road with three.

Two fatal accidents occurred on Highway 7, Highway 403, and on No. 10 Sideroad, Burlington, while Oakville's Ninth Line and Burlington's Elgin St. and Beaufort Drive recorded one each.

Exactly twice as many males as females died on Halton's road last year: 18 to 9. Both motorists, four out of six pedestrians, four out of nine passengers and eight out of ten drivers were male.

In his report, Mr. McWilliams emphasized the largest single cause of death was the drinking driver, who caused 12 of the 27 deaths, or nearly 45 per cent.

Six Years

Over the past six years, from 1961 to 1966, the statistics reveal a total death toll of 175 on Halton County roads, of whom 87, or just under 50 per cent, were drivers, 48 passengers, 37 pedestrians, and three cyclists. The crown attorney said in his summary that though the

standard of police investigation into traffic fatalities is improving, it's apparent the police need the expert assistance of automotive engineers and mechanics to do a thorough job.

Mr. McWilliams hoped an automotive research centre along lines recommended by the National Research Council would soon be established to meet this growing need.

County Council Warden William Coulter said last week that there have been no new developments in the dispute between the county health unit and the public health nurses.

The matter is scheduled to appear before a provincial conciliation board, but both sides are waiting for the province to appoint a chairman.

Nothing has been discussed by either side since the last attempt at conciliation about a month ago. That meeting resulted in more points in dispute than there had been before the two-day talks started.

The nurses' dispute with the county has been dragged out since last September, when they walked off the job.

When the nurses returned they greylisted the health unit, forbidding them to hire any more nurses until the dispute was cleared up. Since then, the health unit has refused to negotiate until the greylisting was lifted, and the nurse said they will not lift it until the negotiations are settled.

The Board of Health report to last week's meeting of county council stated that due to a shortage of nursing staff, some of the usual services will not be carried out this summer.

It was further stated that with the present population of the area, at least 28 nurses should be employed. There are now 15 full time and four part-time public health nurses.

Oakville town council last week asked Warden Coulter to appear and explain the dispute.

Teach English and Western Riding at Looseley Farm
