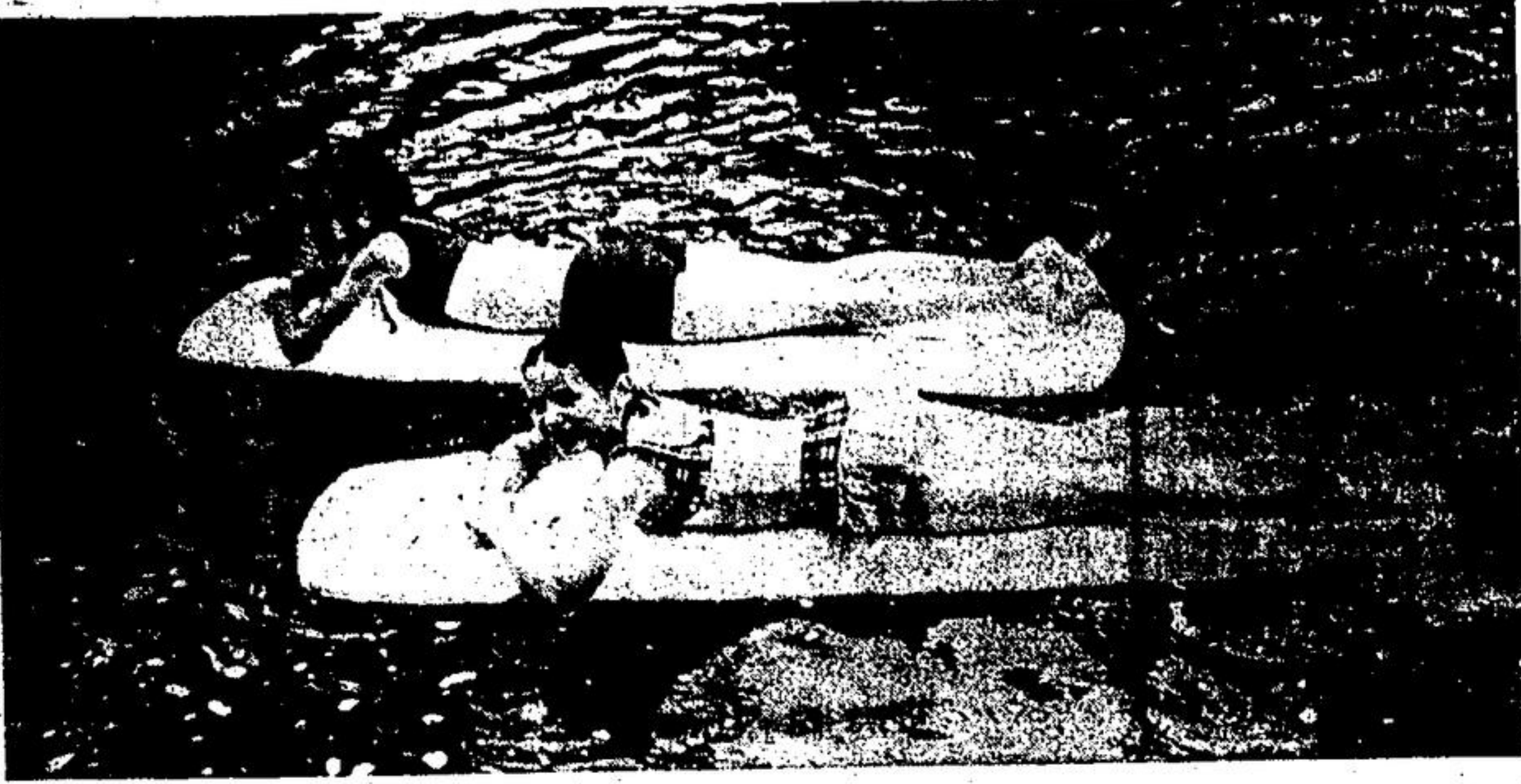


CREDIT SUBSTITUTE FOR SEA SIDE
