SILVER'S SALUTES
SIR SAMUEL LEONARD TILLEY

Of all the Maritime Premiers who came to the Charlottetown Conference in 1864, only New Brunswick's Leonard Tilley was really serious about the original purpose of the meeting, - amalgamation of the Maritimes. But when the Conference was over and the Canadian delegates had presented their plan, none was more enthusiastic about Confederation than Tilley.

Opposition to Confederation was strong among New Brunswickers, who considered themselves a distinct nationality already. In a typical anti-Confederation speech, A. R. Wetmore played on provincial patriotism by recounting this imaginary conversation with his son: "Papa, what country do we live in? - My dear son, we no longer have any country, since Mr. Tilley sold us to the Canadians for 80 cents a head."

Under this kind of attack, Tilley went down to defeat in the 1865 elections, and an alliance of Anti-Confederatians took power in New Brunswick.

In opposition, Tilley fought constantly to re-assert the Confederation idea. Confederation would bring an Inter-colonial Railroad, to link the Maritimes with Upper and Lower Canada, instead of Wetmore's plan of a railway link with the U.S., making New Brunswick dangerously dependent on that country.

Confederation would also make it possible for the colonies to unite in their own defence. This issue became vital in 1866, when a Fenian invasion of New Brunswick necessitated the sending of the British fleet from Halifax.

By the late spring of 1866, Tilley's arguing had been effective enough to force another provincial election. This time it brought victory for Tilley - and for Confederation.
