## Metro Halton Withdraws Offer To Share Mountainview Paving

A letter from R. E. Winter Associates, informing Nick Kirlewski, town engineer, they had been instructed by Mr. McLaughlin of Metropolitan Halton Developments, not to proceed with curbs and asphalt pavement on Mountainview Road, from Sargent to the north side of Humber Hollow, brought astonished expressions at council Tuesday night.
