### Sir Alexander Tilloch Galt

Here was the financial genius who turned the idea of Confederation into a workable reality. The economic purposes and financial arrangements of Confederation were mainly worked out by this man, whose business know-how had already helped build the Grand Trunk. He was later to become Canada's first Minister of Finance.

Of all the men at the 1864 Quebec Conference, Galt was the longest sponsor of the Confederation idea. He had made acceptance of it a condition of his joining the Cartier-Macdonald government of Upper and Lower Canada in 1858.

As M.P. from the Eastern Townships, Galt was the chief spokesman of the English-speaking Protestant minority of Lower Canada, and it was through his efforts that they were guaranteed language and religious rights in the new Province of Quebec.

Galt's business connections often brought him under attack by opponents of Confederation, who claimed he promoted the plan on behalf of the Grand Trunk Railway so that the company could extend the commercial Empire under the protection of a federal government.

But the success of the economic arrangements he set up, their powerful effect on the development of the country, attest to the honest patriotism of their author. Modified from time to time, Galt's arrangements are still today the basis of federal-provincial relations.
