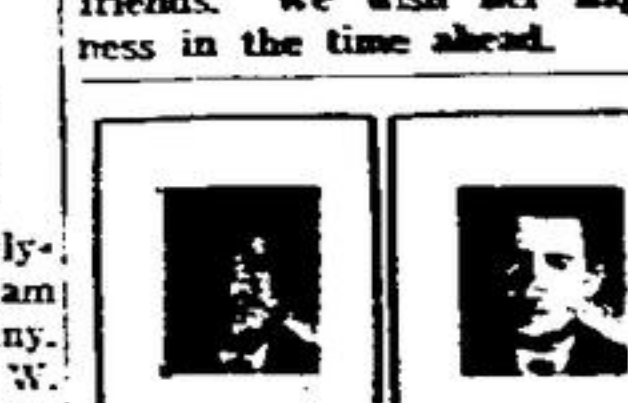

On Monday, August 7, twenty-four students left Oakville train station for a trip to Wetaskiwin, Alberta, sponsored by the Canadian Centennial Commission and the Government of Canada. I was fortunate in being chosen by Acton High School to participate in this exchange. We were accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Reed of Oakville.

Arriving in Alberta two days later we were billeted into private homes for the extent of our visit. We spent a day in Edmonton viewing the Parliament Buildings, the planetarium and the International airport. Trips to various local areas were most interesting—a day spent at Pigeon Lake, a tour of an Indian reservation, and browsing around at the Reynolds Museum in Wetaskiwin which has the largest antique car and machinery display in Canada.

During a tour of local farms I was most impressed by the huge machinery and the vastness of an average farm.

The highlight of our trip was an overnight stay in Banff. We went in the Sulphur Mountain gondola lift by which one ascends to a height of over 9,000 feet above sea level. We visited Lake Louise which is a glacial fed and had a midnight dip in the Banff hot springs pool, where the water comes directly out of the mountain at a temperature reaching approximately 100 degrees F.

We were the guests at various luncheons and banquets, and a formal dinner and dance was given in our honour by the mayor and the council of the City of Wetaskiwin. At this event we received a centennial coin and a peace-pipe which is the symbol of their city as souvenirs of our visit.

The entire trip was an adventure in citizenship. The movement is designed to help teenagers learn more about other provinces and Canada itself. This was a once in a lifetime opportunity to enjoy western hospitality, to make lasting friendships, and to learn more about our country during this centennial year.
