## **SALUTES** Sir Etienne-Pascal Tache

He was the perfect man to preside over a merger of four provinces, two languages, a dozen religions and any number of ethnic groups. Famous for his fairness, broad-mindedness, ability to see everybody's side of a question, and his diplomatic effectiveness, E. P. Tache' was the obvious choice to preside over a constitutional conference. As chairman of the 1864 Quebec Conference that wrote the B.N.A. Act, be was, in a

sense, the first among the Fathers of Confederation. In his youth, Tache' had permitted himself a moment of hot-headedness, participating in the 1837 rebellion for Responsible Government., But a year later his reputation for fairness and honesty got him appointed to Lord Durham's Commission of Enquiry into the causes

of the rebellion. Entering politics under the Union of Upper and Lower Canada in the 1840s, Tache' became a minister in Lord Elgin's first Responsible Cabinet. After 1855 he was prime minister of the United Canadas three

In 1864 when the Grit Leader George Brown agreed to form a coalition with the Macdonald-Cartier Conservatives, Tache' was the obvious man to become prime minister of the coalition government. For it was hard to see how a coalition of such long-standing enemies could work without the tact, liberality and

fairness of Tache'. So it was under Tache's premiership that the constitutional conferences were held and Confederation
